DISCUSSION/BACKGROUND:

2012 Iowa Acts, Senate File 2218, required the department to initiate rulemaking by July 1, 2012, to establish violations for passing a stopped school bus to be deemed a serious violation with increasing periods of driver's license suspension for first, second or subsequent violations.

The Iowa Transportation Commission approved the rule amendments needed to comply with 2012 Iowa Acts, Senate File 2218, at its July 10, 2012, meeting. The adopted and filed document was published in the August 8, 2012, *Iowa Administrative Bulletin* with an effective rule amendments date of September 12, 2012.

The attached Adopted and Filed Emergency After Notice document will change the effective date of the rules from September 12, 2012, to August 15, 2012, so the rules are in effect prior to the 2012-2013 school year.

It is recommended the Commission approve the attached Adopted and Filed Emergency After Notice document to amend the effective date of these rule amendments.

Adopted and Filed Emergency After Notice

Pursuant to the authority of Iowa Code sections 307.10 and 307.12, and 2012 Iowa Acts, Senate File 2218, section 5, the Iowa Department of Transportation, on August 14, 2012, adopted an amendment to Chapter 615, "Sanctions," Iowa Administrative Code.

2012 Iowa Acts, Senate File 2218, section 2, amended Iowa Code section 321.372 to increase penalties for illegally passing a stopped school bus. 2012 Iowa Acts, Senate File 2218, section 5, required the Department to initiate rule making to establish that a violation of Iowa Code subsection 321.372(3) is a serious violation. The amendment imposes driver's license suspension periods of 30 days for a first conviction, 90 days for a second conviction, and 180 days for a third or subsequent conviction under Iowa Code subsection 321.372(3).

Notice of Intended Action for this amendment was published in the June 13, 2012, Iowa Administrative Bulletin as ARC 0158C. The amendment was Adopted and Filed and published in the August 8, 2012, Iowa Administrative Bulletin as ARC 0250C, effective September 12, 2012. However, because of public comment, the Department determined that the amendment should become effective prior to the beginning of the 2012-2013 school year. This rule making changes the effective date from September 12, 2012, to August 15, 2012.

These rules do not provide for waivers. Any person who believes that the person's circumstances meet the statutory criteria for a waiver may petition the Department for a waiver under 761--Chapter 11.

This amendment is identical to the one published under Notice of Intended Action and Adopted and Filed.

The Department finds that this amendment confers a benefit on the public by increasing the safety of students boarding and departing Iowa school buses and should be effective prior to the beginning of the 2012-2013 school year. Therefore, this amendment is filed pursuant to Iowa Code subparagraph 17A.5(2)"b"(2), and the September 12, 2012, effective date is replaced with a August 15, 2012, effective date.

After analysis and review of this rule making, no impact on jobs has been found.

This amendment is intended to implement Iowa Code subsection 321.372(3) and 2012 Iowa Acts, Senate File 2218.

This amendment became effective on August 15, 2012, at which time the Adopted and Filed amendment was rescinded.

The following amendment is adopted

761—615.17(321) Suspension for a serious violation.
701—013.17(321) Suspension for a serious violation.

615.17(1) No change.

615.17(2) "Serious violation" means that:

a. to c. No change.

- <u>d.</u> The person was convicted of violating Iowa Code subsection 321.372(3). The suspension period shall be:
 - (1) 30 days for a first conviction under Iowa Code subsection 321.372(3).
 - (2) 90 days for a second conviction under Iowa Code subsection 321.372(3).
- (3) 180 days for a third or subsequent conviction under Iowa Code subsection 321.372(3).

This rule is intended to implement Iowa Code sections 321.210, 321.372 as amended by 2012 Iowa Acts, Senate File 2218, sections 2 and 5, and 321.491.

Stuart Anderson, Planning, Programming and Modal Division, said Butler county submitted an immediate opportunity RISE funding request to construct approximately 2,400 feet of new roadway north of 220th Street northwest of Shell Rock. This project will provide improved access to more than 31 acres for industrial and manufacturing purposes.

To maximize RISE funding for this project, staff evaluated this application as a RISE local development project. Under RISE local development criteria this project scored 47 points. The total estimated project cost is \$606,991 and the county is requesting a RISE grant of \$303,496 which is 50 percent of the total RISE eligible project cost. Butler county will provide a 50 percent local match. He introduced Jeff Kolb, Butler County Resource and Development Group.

Mr. Kolb introduced John Riherd, Butler County Engineer, and Bill Rhodes, Iowa Northern Railway. Mr. Kolb said this will be their first rail-served industrial park. It is a project they have been working on for three to four years. Right across from the rail is their ethanol refinery which has driven the development in this park. They are currently working with two active prospects for the park and are to the point where they need to get some infrastructure in place. They have commitments from Central Iowa Rural Water to provide the water and sewage treatment. The local telephone company will run fiber optics to the park. The investment will be fairly substantial and there are a lot of partners in the project in addition to the Iowa Northern Railway.

Mr. Anderson reviewed the recommendation of staff.

Commission Blouin moved, Commissioner Rose seconded the Commission, based on the capital investment commitment and potential for future job creation, reclassify the project as a RISE Local Development project in the February 2012 round of applications and award a RISE grant of \$303,496 or up to 50 percent of the total RISE-eligible project cost, whichever is less, from the county share of the RISE fund. Wiley Yanney Stuart Anderson, Planning, Programming and Modal Division, said the city of Burlington submitted an immediate opportunity RISE funding request to reconstruct approximately 2,323 feet of Bluff Road and to construct a right-turn lane on Des Moines Avenue located on the northeast side of Burlington. These improvements are necessary to provide improved access to the expansion of CNH manufacturing facility that produces Case and New Holland brands of construction and agricultural equipment. This project will result in the creation of 118 new jobs along with an associated capital investment of more than \$16 million. The average starting wage of the positions to be created is \$17.29 per hour which is about 100 percent of the average wage rate for Des Moines county.

Mr. Anderson said staff's recommendation would be a RISE grant of \$923,000 which is 80 percent of the total project cost with a local match of 20 percent. The job creation commitment results in a RISE cost per job assisted ratio \$7,822.03 and a total capital investment per RISE dollar of \$17.34. He introduced Jim Ferneau, Burlington City Manager.

Mr. Ferneau introduced Zach Janes, Southeast Iowa Regional Planning Council. Mr. Ferneau said Case was in a spot in 2007 where they weren't sure they were going to continue but they have rebounded within the construction and agricultural equipment area so this is a great opportunity to add jobs to their area. The existing road that services that area is in need of work. This project will be a major improvement along with the additional turn lane. Truck traffic is estimated to double in and out of that area. Long term this area is also where a bike trail will go through so this project will help to set it up making sure the roadway meets the safety separation they otherwise wouldn't have.

Mr. Anderson reviewed staff's recommendation.

Commissioner Wiley moved, Commissioner Reasner seconded the Commission, based on the capital investment and job creation commitments, award a RISE grant of \$923,000 or up to 80 percent of the total RISE-eligible project cost, whichever is less, from the city share of the RISE fund. All voted aye.
