Title Revitalize Iowa's Sound Economy (RISE) Project Settlement – Rock Rapids

DISCUSSION/BACKGROUND:

On June 12, 2012, the city of Rock Rapids was awarded a RISE grant of \$123,895 to assist with the construction of approximately 350 feet of Pearl Street north of Iowa 9 located on the northeast side of town to provide access to the site of Simply Said's vinyl wall décor manufacturing and distribution facility.

Commission approval of this project was contingent on the creation of 25 new jobs within three years after completion of the roadway. Associated capital investment was to be \$950,000.

On October 23, 2012, the roadway was opened to traffic. As of October 2015, the city of Rock Rapids had not met the job creation contingency. The department was advised that an average of 4 total jobs were created.

The method of calculation and amount of proposed settlement was provided to the city. The city of Rock Rapids has agreed to repay the proposed settlement of \$32,816.

PROPOSAL/ACTION RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended the Commission approve the project settlement and proposed payment to the city share of the RISE Fund of \$32,816 for the city of Rock Rapids.

Craig Markley, Office of Systems Planning; For RISE Immediate Opportunity projects there are job creation commitments associated with receiving the funds. The Department monitors these contingencies to assure that they are met within three years of the roadway being open to traffic. If the contingencies are not met, the Department will seek partial or full revocation of the grant.

Today we are presenting a proposed settlement with Rock Rapids for a RISE project awarded in June of 2012. The city received a grant of \$123,895 for roadway improvements contingent on the creation of 25 new jobs by Simply Said within three years of project completion. In October of 2012 the roadway was opened to traffic. However, the company associated with this project was only able to create an average of 4 jobs. Based on the settlement policy the city has agreed to a repayment of \$32,816.

Staff recommends the Commission approve the proposed settlement for the Rock Rapids RISE project.

Title Revitalize Iowa's Sound Economy (RISE) Project Settlement – Washington

DISCUSSION/BACKGROUND:

On May 8, 2007, the city of Washington was awarded a RISE grant of \$580,000 to assist with the grading and paving of Fillmore Street from Airport Road west 2,700 feet to 12th Street.

Commission approval of this project was contingent on the creation of 40 new jobs and retention of 105 jobs within three years after completion of the roadway. Associated capital investment was to be \$7.5 million.

On May 2, 2012, the roadway was opened to traffic. As of May 2015, the city of Washington had not met the job creation contingency. The department was advised that an average of 100 total jobs were retained.

The method of calculation and amount of proposed settlement was provided to the city. The city of Washington has agreed to repay the proposed settlement of \$49,862.

PROPOSAL/ACTION RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended the Commission approve the project settlement and proposed payment to the city share of the RISE Fund of \$49,862 for the city of Washington.

To the city of Sageville, the portion of Iowa 32 and U.S. 52/Iowa 3 that lies within the corporation limits of Sageville.

To Dubuque County, the portion of U.S. 52/lowa 3 that lies within Dubuque County.

These total 9.41 miles.

Steve Leonard, representing the Asphalt Paving Association of Iowa- believes this is now an opportunity for the Department and the Commission to consider putting a greater emphasis on stewardship of existing interstates and primary highway system through rehabilitation and maintenance projects. Maintenance is done slowly and consistently over time instead of rehabilitating or reconstructing an entire project. Using sustainable rehabilitation methods improves pavement performance and will directly affect a great percentage of Iowans through safety and well-being. Time to prepare shovel ready projects like maintenance and rehabilitation projects are shorter than reconstruction. We feel there is an opportunity for more projects that are shovel ready. I would like to acknowledge over the last twenty years, the national association has recognized four projects in the state of Iowa with a top national award in asphalt paving, the Sheldon G. Hayes Award. You've got some of the best asphalt contractors in the nation working for you and the state of Iowa.
