Stuart Anderson, Planning, Programming and Modal Division; In order to comply with last year's Code of Iowa changes that permitted the Commission to adopt a Federal-Aid Transportation Funding Swap we are proposing amendments to two rule chapters. Those two chapters are chapters 161 Federal-Aid Highway Bridge Program and chapter 162 Surface Transportation Block Grant Program. In both of those rule chapters, we add a new rule that states projects may be swapped with primary road funds; again, that would be consistent with a policy you've adopted.

In chapter 161 there are also a few minor changes, one of them is to rename the chapter from Federal-Aid Highway Bridge Program to Highway Bridge Program for Cities and Counties to reflect the fact that those funds can be swapped with primary road funds and aren't necessarily always federal-aid funds. Code references and program names were also updated to comply with current references.

Therefore, it is recommended the Commission adopt the rule amendments included in the attached, draft Notice of Intended Action.

Commissioner Rielly made a motion to approve the rule amendments as attached. Commissioner Yanney seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

TRANSPORTATION DEPARTMENT [761]

Draft Notice of Intended Action as of April 2, 2018

The Department of Transportation hereby proposes to amend Chapter 161, "Federal-Aid Highway Bridge Program," and Chapter 162, "Surface Transportation Block Grant Program," Iowa Administrative Code.

Legal Authority for Rule Making

This rule making is proposed under the authority provided in Iowa Code sections 307.12 and 307A.2(4).

State or Federal Law Implemented

This rule making implements, in whole or in part, Iowa Code sections 307.44 and 313.4(1).

Purpose and Summary

The Department is proposing to amend Chapters 161 and 162 to add language stating that primary road funds may be swapped with Surface Transportation Block Grant (STBG) funds allocated to cities and counties for road and bridge construction projects. The highway bridge program is funded through STBG funds. This change is necessary to make the rules consistent with 2017 Iowa Acts, Chapter 13, which amended Iowa Code section 313.4(1) and allows for the swap of STBG funds.

The following explains the additional proposed amendments to Chapters 161 and 162:

- Amend the title of Chapter 161 to strike federal-aid and add cities and counties. The
 change in the title is being made to clarify that the highway bridge program is for cities
 and counties and with the addition of the swap language, the funds will no longer be
 federal aid.
- Strike "federal-aid" within rule 761—161.1(307) for consistency.

- Amend rules 761—161.2(307) and 761—162.2(307) to add reference to the
 Department's website where additional information may be found on the swap process.
- Amend rule 761—161.3(307) to add the words "Block Grant" to the Surface
 Transportation Program and amend the wording of the federal citation for consistency.
- Amend the implementation sentences within both chapters to add reference to Iowa
 Code section 313.4(1). The implementation sentence for Chapter 162 is also amended to
 strike reference to 2016 Iowa Acts, Senate File 2320 and add a reference to Iowa Code
 section 307.44 for consistency.
- Correct the parenthetical statutes of existing rules within Chapter 162 to reference Iowa
 Code chapter 307 and strike reference to 2016 Iowa Acts, Senate File 2320.

Iowa Code section 313.4(1)"c" allows the Transportation Commission to allocate money from the primary road fund to be swapped. The Transportation Commission approved the proposed changes to Chapters 161 and 162 at its April 10 meeting.

Fiscal Impact

The amendment to Iowa Code section 313.4(1)"c" increases efficiency and reduces project costs. The Department is implementing this Iowa Code change and it is early in the implementation stage and swap projects have not yet been constructed. Therefore, a fiscal impact cannot be determined but the impact will be positive.

Jobs Impact

After analysis and review of this rule making, the Department has determined that the proposed rule amendments may have a positive impact on private sector jobs and employment opportunities in Iowa. The rules will result in cost savings that will in turn be reinvested into

additional construction projects throughout the state. The additional projects should increase

the number of jobs for the contracting and consulting industry.

The department, in consultation with county and city officials through their representative organizations, has dedicated a portion of these funds for replacement and rehabilitation of city and county bridges.</u>

ITEM 6. Adopt the following **new** rule 761—161.4(313):

Craig Markley, Office of Systems Planning We have three RISE projects for your review this morning. The first application is from the city of Sioux Center. There is a delegation present who will provide comments following my presentation of background information.

The city submitted a Local Development RISE funding request to assist in construction of approximately 720 feet of 16th Street Northeast located on the northeast side of town.

This project is necessary to provide access to five lots totaling more than 12 acres for industrial purposes.

Under our RISE Local Development criteria, this project received a rating of 47 points. The total estimated cost of the project is \$515,698. The city of Sioux Center is requesting a RISE grant of \$257,849 and will be providing 50 percent in local match.

Before I proceed to staff's recommendation, I would like to introduce Dennis Dokter, Assistant City Manager, who will provide some comments.

It is recommended the Commission, based on the capital investment commitment and potential for future job creation, award a RISE grant of \$257,849 or up to 50 percent of the total RISE-eligible project cost, whichever is less. Funding will come from the city share of the RISE Fund.


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


