Notice of Intended Action

Proposing rule making related to updates of administrative procedures and providing an opportunity for public comment

The Department of Transportation hereby proposes to amend Chapter 10, "Administrative Rules," Chapter 11, "Waiver of Rules," and Chapter 12, "Declaratory Orders," Iowa Administrative Code.

Legal Authority for Rule Making

This rule making is proposed under the authority provided in Iowa Code sections 17A.7, 17A.9, 17A.9A and 307.12.

State or Federal Law Implemented

This rule making implements, in whole or in part, Iowa Code sections 17A.7, 17A.9 and 17A.9A.

Purpose and Summary

The proposed amendments to Chapters 10, 11 and 12 update the office name of the Department's rules administrator and add email as an option for a person wanting to submit a petition for rule making, petition for waiver, or petition for declaratory order to the Department. The proposed amendments to Chapter 10 also modify language in subparagraph 10.2(2)"a"(2) to suggest that persons who have requested an oral presentation provide the Department with the general subject of the presentation.

Fiscal Impact

This rule making has no fiscal impact to the State of Iowa.

Jobs Impact

After analysis and review of this rule making, no impact on jobs has been found.

Waivers

Any person who believes that the person's circumstances meet the statutory criteria for a waiver may petition the Department for a waiver under 761—Chapter 11.

Public Comment

Any interested person may submit written comments concerning this proposed rule making or may submit a written request to make an oral presentation at a public hearing. Written comments or requests to present oral comments in response to this rule making must be received by the Department no later than 4:30 p.m. on April 2, 2019. Comments should be directed to:

The public hearing will be canceled without further notice if no oral presentation is requested.

Review by Administrative Rules Review Committee

The Administrative Rules Review Committee, a bipartisan legislative committee which oversees rule making by executive branch agencies, may, on its own motion or on written request by any individual or group, review this rule making at its regular monthly meeting or at a special meeting. The Committee's meetings are open to the public, and interested persons may be heard as provided in Iowa Code section 17A.8(6).

The following rule-making actions are proposed:

- ITEM 1. Amend subrule 10.1(2) as follows:
- **10.1(2)** Address. The <u>mailing</u> address of the department's rules administrator is: Rules Administrator, Operations and Finance Division Strategic Communications and Policy, Iowa Department of Transportation, 800 Lincoln Way, Ames, Iowa 50010. The email address of the rules administrator may be found on the department's website at iowadot.gov/administrativerules.
 - ITEM 2. Amend subparagraph 10.2(2)"a"(2) as follows:
- (2) If an oral presentation is requested, the <u>requester is encouraged to set forth the</u> general content subject of the presentation shall be indicated.
 - ITEM 3. Amend subrule 10.3(1), introductory paragraph, as follows:
- 10.3(1) The department shall accept and consider, from any person or agency, petitions for rule making when submitted to the department's rules administrator by mail or email and prepared in conformance with the following:
 - ITEM 4. Amend **761—Chapter 10**, implementation sentence, as follows:

These rules are intended to implement Iowa Code sections 17A.1 to 17A.9, 17A.19, and 307.12 and section 307A.2 as amended by 2015 Iowa Acts, House File 635, section 20.

- ITEM 5. Amend subrule 11.5(3) as follows:
- 11.5(3) Submission of petition. A petition for waiver from the requirements of a rule shall be submitted to the rules administrator either by mail to Rules Administrator, Operations and Finance Division Strategic Communications and Policy, Iowa Department of Transportation, 800 Lincoln Way, Ames, Iowa 50010; or by email to the rules administrator's email address listed on the department's website at iowadot.gov/administrativerules.
 - ITEM 6. Amend subrule 11.8(2) as follows:
- 11.8(2) The operations and finance division department's rules administrator shall, at a minimum, retain for five years records relating to waivers granted or denied under this chapter.
 - ITEM 7. Amend subrule 12.2(2) as follows:

Title Revitalize Iowa's Sound Economy (RISE) Application – Cedar Rapids					

DISCUSSION/BACKGROUND:

The city of Cedar Rapids submitted a RISE Immediate Opportunity application requesting a grant to assist in the construction of turn lanes on 6th Street SW located on the south side of town. This project is anticipated to be completed by June 2020.

This improvement is necessary to provide improved access to the proposed expansion of West Side Transport, a trucking company. This company conforms to the legislative requirements of the RISE program.

The improvement will support:

- The retention of 69 full-time jobs.
- \$9,066,862 in associated capital investment.

The RISE cost per job assisted will be \$12,000 and there will be a total capital investment of \$10.95 for each RISE dollar requested.

PROPOSAL/ACTION RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended the Commission, based on the capital investment and job retention commitments, award a RISE grant of \$828,000 or up to 80 percent of the total RISE-eligible project cost, whichever is less, from the city share of the RISE Fund.

Craig Markley, Systems Planning Bureau; The city of Cedar Rapids submitted a RISE Immediate Opportunity application request to assist in the construction of turn lanes on 6th Street SW located on the south side of town. The proposed improvements will result in the retention of 69 full-time jobs at West Side Trucking within three years of roadway construction completion. Along with \$9,066,862 in associated capital investment. The average wage of retained positions is \$28.49 per hour, which is 132% of the average labor shed wage rate.

The RISE grant recommended is \$828,000; local participation is 56% or \$1,050,098 for a total cost of \$1,878,098. Total cost per job assisted is \$12,000 and total capital investment per RISE dollar is \$10.98

Brenna Fall from the City of Cedar Rapids made a brief comment regarding the encouragement of West Side Trucking to stay in Cedar Rapids due to these improvements and adding of turn lanes.

It is recommended the Commission, based on the capital investment and job retention commitments, award a RISE grant of \$828,000 or up to 80 percent of the total RISE-eligible project cost, whichever is less, from the city share of the RISE Fund.

Commission Yanney made a motion to award the RISE grant as recommended. Commissioner Rose seconded the motion. Motion passes unanimously.

Stuart Anderson, Program, Planning, and Modal Division director; last month we presented a recommendation to award \$1.461 million of Federal National Highway Freight Program funding through the Linking Iowa's Freight Transportation System Program. This LIFTS program is an application based program to support rail freight and inter-modal freight across the state.

The recommended as listed on the Commission is to award funding to two projects. The first is \$925,000 grant to support a new cargo facility at the Easter Iowa Airport, here in Cedar Rapids. The second is a \$536,000 grant to support a transload facility in Mt. Pleasant. We haven't received any questions or comments on the recommendation. Therefore, it is recommended the Commission approve the LIFTS program funding recommendations as listed.
