### DISCUSSION/BACKGROUND:

A proposed amendment to the highway section of the 2016-2020 Iowa Transportation Improvement Program (Program) will be presented. The proposed amendment will allow the addition or advancement of highway and bridge projects with an estimated cost of \$91.7 million to fiscal year 2016 of the Program. This includes six interstate construction projects; nine noninterstate pavement modernization projects; four noninterstate bridge modernization projects; three safety projects; and two noninterstate system enhancement projects.

This Program amendment is possible because additional funding was made available after the Program was initially approved in June. The additional funding is available due to favorable construction project lettings, Iowa DOT budget savings, and receipt of federal funding that exceeded forecast amounts.

The construction projects included in this amendment are planned to begin in calendar year 2016.

A list of project changes recommended for the highway section of Program is attached

### PROPOSAL/ACTION RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended the Commission approve changes to the 2016-2020 Iowa Transportation Improvement Program as listed. It is also recommended the Commission approve the use of condemnation, if necessary, to acquire property for the projects included in this amendment.

### PPM-2016-55

Stuart Anderson, Planning, Programming and Modal Division presented Due to project cost savings, lowa DOT budget savings, and receipt of federal funding that exceeded forecast amounts we recommend this amendment to the 2016-2020 lowa Transportation Improvement Program. The proposed amendment totals approximately 91.7 million dollars and will allow six interstate construction projects, nine noninterstate pavement modernization projects; four noninterstate bridge modernization projects; three safety projects; and two noninterstate system enhancement projects in fiscal year 2016 of the program. All of these projects are planned to begin in calendar year 2016. Therefore it is recommended that the Commission approve the changes to the 2016-2020 lowa transportation improvement program as listed on the attachment to the commission order. ### PPM-2016-56

Tammy Nicholson, Office of Rail Transportation presented the Railroad Revolving Loan and Grant Program (RRLG) – this recommendation is regarding the program policies for the Job Creation Program. The RRLG provides assistance to railroads to create jobs, and for economic development, and to provide assistance to railroads for the conservation and improvement of the Rail Transportation System. Funding is also available for railroad planning and development studies. Applications may be submitted at anytime and reviewed as funding is available. We presented our recommendation to the Commission at last month's commission workshop along with the applications to the RRLG Program Targeted Jobs Creation project category. The recommendation is to increase the maximum amount of grant per job from \$6000 to \$12,000 per job. Also we recommend eliminating the \$12,000 cap for the maximum amount per targeted job creation project. We recommend to approve the RRLG program funding recommendations as listed on the commission order.

Railroad Revolving Loan and Grant (RRLG) Program: Modification to Boone Scenic Valley Railroad

Title Industrial Park Line Phase I

### DISCUSSION/BACKGROUND:

In November 2015, RRLG funds were awarded to the Boone Scenic Valley Railroad Industrial Park Line Phase I project. The award amount was based a commitment to retain and create a total of 40 jobs; however, the job creation/retention commitment has increased to 55. Because project construction has not started, the increased job commitment supports a modification to the award to provide additional grant funding as summarized below. The total award amount will not change.

### PPM-2016-57

Tammy Nicholson, Office of Rail Transportation said this is in regards to the Railroad Revolving Loan and Grant (RRLG) program modification to the Boone and Scenic Valley Railroad Industrial Park Phase I project. In November of 2015 the Commission awarded the RRLG funds to the Boone Scenic Valley Railroad for this project. The award amount was based on a commitment to retain and create a total of 40 jobs. However the job creation retention commitment has increased to 55. So because the project construction has been started the increased job commitment supports a modification to the award to provide additional grant funding. The total award amount will not change. The recommendation is to modify the funding for a grant of \$330,000 for 55 jobs based at \$6000 per job and a loan of \$226,050 be awarded; for a total amount that remains the same of \$556,050. We recommend you approve the modification to the RRLG award to the Boone and Scenic Valley Railroad Industrial Park Phase I as listed in the commission order.

### DISCUSSION/BACKGROUND:

Mitchell County and the city of Osage submitted a RISE Immediate Opportunity application requesting a grant to assist in roadway improvements of approximately 1,962 feet of 13th Street and 1,888 feet of 350<sup>th</sup> Street located on the southeast side of town. This project is anticipated to be completed by October 2018.

Because this project will provide improved access to more than 43 acres for industrial purposes and to maximize RISE support for this project, staff evaluated the application as a RISE Local Development project.

The evaluation and rating for the project will be discussed.

### PROPOSAL/ACTION RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended the Commission, based on the capital investment commitment and potential for future job creation, reclassify the project as a RISE Local Development project in the February 2016 round of applications and award a RISE grant of \$349,868 from the county share of the RISE Fund and \$116,624 from the city share of the RISE Fund for a total of \$466,492 or up to 50 percent of the total RISE-eligible project cost, whichever is less.

Craig Markley, Office of Systems Planning said we have one RISE project for your review this afternoon from Mitchell County and the city of Osage. There is a delegation present that I will introduce following my presentation of background information. The county and city submitted an immediate opportunity RISE funding request to assist in roadway improvements of approximately 1,962 feet of 13<sup>th</sup> Street and 1,888 feet of 350<sup>th</sup> Street located on the southeast side of town. This project will provide access to more than 43 acres for industrial purposes and to maximize RISE support for this project, staff evaluated the application as a RISE Local Development project. Under RISE Local Development criteria, the project scored 56 points, total estimated cost \$932,983. A RISE grant of \$466,492 is being requested, with \$349,868 from the county share of the RISE Fund and \$116,624 from the city share of the RISE Fund. The city and county will be providing 50 percent of the total in match. Before stating the staff recommendation I'd like to invite Brenda Dryer, Mitchell County Economic Development Director to introduce the rest of the delegation.

Brenda Dryer - Good Afternoon, like Craig said I'm Brenda Dryer and I get the opportunity to work as the Economic Developer for Mitchell County and the communities that are part of that county. I'm joined this afternoon with Joel Voaklander is one of our Mitchel County Supervisors and Jerry Dunlay who works as the Public Works Director for Osage. We are very excited about this RISE project, this will support the expansions of two outstanding Iowa companies; Valant BioSciences Corporation and A to Z Drying. Both are very strong bioscience companies. VBC we recruited to the state of Iowa dn Osage just a couple of years ago. They've been in production about a year, and they are already discussing expanding in our state. While Mitchell County is the applicant for this project, this is indeed a project based on a strong project with the city of Osage. Both entities understand just how important this road is to support expansions at both of these companies now, and into the future. We also look to the state of Iowa as a partner because the RISE funding that you are considering today is key to moving these expansion projects along. We are here today if you have any last minute questions you would like to ask us, we are available to talk about those as it relates to the roadway project, and I can talk about the expansion projects at either industry. Before I let Jerry and Joel say a few words I would like to extend my thanks to Craig and Jennifer who have been most helpful working with us on this application. Thank you again for your consideration of our project in Mitchel County.

Joel Voaklander: I'm a Supervisor from Mitchell County, I would like to thank The Transportation Commission for considering this RISE project as they have in the past, which helps move our economy forward.

Jerry Dunlay – I would like to interject the same, this is a very important project for us with the joint county and city project and all of the jobs that will be coming in the future, we have already begun quite a few with this project and there is expansion in the works. We really apprecitat the cooperation that we get with the state and the DOT and look forward to working with Jennifer on the project.

Craig – it is recommended the Commission based on the capital investment commitment and potential for future job creation, reclassify the project as a RISE Local Development project in the February 2016 round of applications and award a RISE grant of \$349,868 from the county share of the RISE Fund and \$116,624 from the city share of the RISE Fund for a total of \$466,492 or up to 50 percent of the total RISE-eligible project cost, whichever is less.

Commissioner comment – Commissioner Rose: I'd like to comment that we are just as excited about the RISE grant as you are and we thank you for coming.
