Commission Comments

1. Presentation of Gavel to Outgoing Commission Chair Miles

Commission Chair Yanney expressed appreciation to Commissioner Miles for her service and leadership for the past year. On behalf of the Commission she presented Commissioner Miles with a gavel commemorating her service as Commission Chair.

Commissioner Chair Miles expressed appreciation to her fellow commissioners for their confidence in her. It was an interesting year because we have more work to do than we have money. Thank you for your diligence on this and to Director Trombino III and staff for their work and guidance throughout the year.

Commissioner Cleaveland expressed appreciation to Commissioner Miles for her leadership in the last year and for keeping the Commission on track. Appreciate all you have done for the Commission.

Director Paul Trombino III thanked Commissioner Miles for her service as chair this last year and said we look forward to working with you for the next four years.

Commissioner Rose congratulated Commissioner Miles on her reappointment for another four years on the Commission.

2. Washington, D.C. Trip

Commissioner Rose said the Commission went to Washington, D.C. April 24 and 25, and it was probably one of the finer meetings they had in D.C. Dan Franklin, Office of Policy and Legislative Services, was the group leader and kept everyone on task. One may wonder why the Commission goes to D.C. and he thought Commissioner Cleaveland said it best "to build relationships." Commissioner Rose said he thought the Commission did a great job of that as they met with all the lowa representatives and senators, and he thought they were in tune to what the Commission is trying to accomplish in lowa.

One of the biggest things the Commission has been tackling is the five-year program. We are getting a draft today and look forward to approving that at the June meeting.

Director Trombino III said today we are celebrating one hundred years of transportation in the state of lowa. There will be a short ceremony at 3 p.m. today in our auction building on the south side of the complex and everyone is welcome to attend. He noted the Governor and Lt. Transportation has changed so much in 100 years and is so important to the state of lowa as well as the Commission's continuing work as we go forward.

2. AASHTO Spring Meeting

Director Trombino III said he attended a spring national transportation meeting in Providence, Rhode Island last week. It was a good meeting with a lot of good discussion about ongoing issues. One of the issues was performance measurement and how that is included in MAP-21. Victor Mendez gave a presentation on where they are from their perspective. Overall, it was a good message. He had the opportunity to connect with counterparts from the Midwest and plan the summer meeting where the Midwest states get together and exchange ongoing processes and ideas and look for improvements to our regional connection.

ITEM 1. Amend subrule 401.9(4) as follows:

401.9(4) *Plates*. Firefighter plates are limited to five characters. Personalized plates are not available. When a new series of firefighter plates is issued to replace a current series or the plate has been lost, stolen, or damaged, an applicant may obtain replacement plates containing the applicant's previous plate number upon payment of the statutory fee.

ITEM 2. Amend subrule 401.10(3) as follows:

401.10(3) EMS plates are limited to five characters. Personalized plates are not available. When a new series of EMS plates is issued to replace a current series or the plate has been lost, stolen, or damaged, an applicant may obtain replacement plates containing the applicant's previous plate number upon payment of the statutory fee.

ITEM 3. Amend rule **761—425.3(322**), definition of "Principal place of business," as follows:

"Principal place of business" means a building actually occupied where the public and the department may contact the owner or operator during regular business hours. In lieu of a building, a travel trailer dealer may use a manufactured or mobile home as an office if taxes are current or a travel trailer as an office if registration fees are current. The principal place of business must be located in this state.

ITEM 4. Amend subrule 425.12(1) as follows:

425.12(1) *Verification of compliance*. Before a motor vehicle dealer's license is issued, an investigator from a representative of the department shall may physically inspect an applicant's principal place of business to verify compliance with this rule.

The city of Pleasant Hill submitted a RISE Local Development application in the February 2013 round requesting a grant to assist in construction of a right-turn lane on Iowa 163, approximately 1,215 feet of Northeast 75th Street, and approximately 1,340 feet of new roadway west of proposed Northeast 75th Street located on the northeast side of town.	
This project is necessary to provide access to four lots totaling more than 64 acres for industrial, manufacturing, warehouse distribution and professional office purposes. This project is anticipated to be completed by November 2013.

Craig Markley, Office of Systems Planning, reviewed a RISE Local Development application from the city of Pleasant Hill to construct a right-turn lane on Iowa 163 approximately 1,215 feet of Northeast 75th Street and approximately 1,340 feet of new roadway west of proposed Northeast 75th Street located on the northeast side of town. This project is necessary to provide access to four lots totaling more than 64 acres for industrial, manufacturing, warehouse distribution, and professional office purposes.

Under RISE Local Development criteria, the project received a rating of 43 points. Total estimated project cost is \$1,966,425. The city is requesting a RISE grant of \$983,213 and will provide a 50 percent local match. He introduced Don Sandor, Pleasant Hill City Manager.

Mr. Sandor introduced the delegation and said this project is a wonderful opportunity for Pleasant Hill and Polk county.

Mr. Markley reviewed staff's recommendation.

Commissioner Wiley moved, Commissioner Reasner seconded the Commission, based on the capital investment commitment and potential for future job creation, award a RISE grant of \$983,213 or up to 50 percent of the total RISE-eligible project cost, whichever is less, from the city share of the RISE fund. 

Craig Markley, Office of Systems Planning, presented a RISE Immediate Opportunity funding request from the city of Clinton to construct approximately 525 feet of new roadway north from 44th Avenue South into the Lincolnway Industrial Rail and Air Park located on the southwest side of town. The proposed improvements will result in the creation of 62 new full-time jobs within three years along with \$36,236,224 in associated capital investment. Average wage of the created positions is \$17.79 per hour which is 114 percent of the Clinton county average labor shed wage rate of \$15.59.

Mr. Markley said the RISE grant recommended is \$274,450. Local participation is 20 percent or \$68,613 for a total cost of \$343,063. The RISE cost per job is \$4,426.61 and total capital investment per RISE dollar is \$132.03. He introduced Mayor Mark Vulich.

Mayor Vulich introduced the delegation members. He expressed appreciation for the opportunity to apply for this grant. The rail park has been a dream since the late 1990s, and Rail One is the first occupant of the park. This road is a great selling point to the occupancy of the park. Also, the project opens up a 20-acre lot and a five-acre lot immediately adjacent to the Rail One property for future development.

Mr. Markley reviewed the recommendation of staff.

Commissioner Rose moved, Commissioner Miles seconded the Commission, based on the capital investment and job creation commitments, award a RISE grant of \$274,450 or up to 80 percent of the total RISE-eligible project cost, whichever is less, from the city share of the RISE fund. All voted aye.




