### **Commission Comments**

# 1. Commission Workshop

Commissioner Reasner said the Commission met this morning to review and discuss a variety of topics including the highway program balance and the possibility of an amendment depending on what Congress does with the Highway Trust Fund; the August Commission tour in eastern lowa; an overview of the RISE program and the Railroad Revolving Loan and Grant Program; the RISE projects on the agenda today; the Highway Trust Fund and the potential impacts to our program in the event Congress does not reauthorized spending or take some temporary measure to deal with the Trust Fund at least through December; and an interesting presentation from the Office of Safety regarding J-Turns which is a tool the Department has contemplated using at various locations in Iowa. Commissioner Reasner said it was a very informative meeting.

### **Staff Comments**

# 1. Highway Trust Fund

Paul Trombino III, Director, said U.S. DOT and Secretary Anthony Foxx gave notice to all the states that come August 1 they will only provide partial reimbursement of funds that the states request at the federal level. This is being done because Congress has yet to take action to assure Highway Trust Fund levels. Essentially the Highway Trust Fund will start to fall below what they call the critical level of \$4 billion toward the latter part of July. Director Trombino III said the Department has been taking a number of steps to get prepared. We have assessed potential impacts to all federally funded highway projects in the state due to this reduced funding reimbursement. Through our analysis, the lowa DOT has concluded that all federally-funded projects will remain on schedule and contractors will be fully reimbursed through this construction season. Also, the lowa DOT has communicated with cities and counties in lowa that they will be fully reimbursed with federal funds and that the lowa DOT will absorb the full impact of partial reimbursements for the state.

As discussed with the Commission this morning, Director Trombino III noted the Department has implemented some actions to mitigate the impacts if Congress fails to take action by the end of September; that is to delay some projects beginning this month. Those projects are U.S. 218 installation of paved shoulders in Cedar Falls at County Road C-50; Interstate 80 improving the westbound rest area in Jasper County; U.S. 61 grading and wetland mitigation for a four-lane construction in Louisa County to south of Iowa 92 to Muscatine County; and Interstate 74 construction of local road connections and traffic signs in Bettendorf. These projects were scheduled to be let in July and August and we have moved them to October and November. He noted this delay will not impact the overall schedule of those projects. If Congress addresses the Highway Trust Fund situation this fall, these projects will proceed with bidding later this year. If Congress doesn't act, it is likely we will identify more projects to be delayed.

# **EXHIBIT A**

**Boone County** 

Description: All of 219<sup>th</sup> Lane from its connection with Iowa 17 southerly and westerly to its termination, a length of approximately 0.48 miles.



Scott Dockstader, District 1 Engineer, said the Department is working with Boone County on the transfer of jurisdiction of 219<sup>th</sup> Lane from the state to Boone County. In 1968 when the U.S.30/lowa 17 interchange was built, a half mile frontage gravel road was also built to provide access to five businesses, a residence, and a small park. The road carries about 178 vehicles per day.

Mr. Dockstader said there have been some issues over the last year with the residents along the roadway because a gravel road is one of the lowest volume roadways in the district and is usually the last roadway plowed after a major storm because we are working on interstates, four-lane roadways, and state highways. In addition, there is quite a bit of rutting from the number of vehicles that travel the gravel road. Based on those concerns, staff has been working with Boone County and has come to an agreement where the lowa DOT will pay \$285,000 of the total estimated project cost of \$410,000 to pave that gravel road. The County will pick up the remaining costs. In addition, the County has agreed to take over ownership and maintenance of the road.

Commissioner Putney moved, Commissioner Miles seconded the Commission approve the transfer of jurisdiction for all of 219<sup>th</sup> Lanes as described to Boone County. All voted aye.


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

Craig Markley, Office of Systems Planning, said the city of West Des Moines submitted an immediate opportunity RISE funding request to construct Maffitt Lake Road from Veterans Parkway southeast approximately 4,000 feet to South Eighth Street and to reconstruct South Eighth Street approximately 2,000 feet north under lowa 5 to the development site of a new Microsoft data center facility. Because this project will provide access to more than 280 acres for professional office and data center purposes and to maximize RISE support for the project, staff evaluated the application as a RISE Local Development project. Under RISE Local Development criteria, the project scored 71 points. The total estimated project cost is \$7,038,750. The county is requesting a RISE grant of \$3,519,375 and will provide a 50 percent local match. He introduced Clyde Evans, Director, Community and Economic Development.
