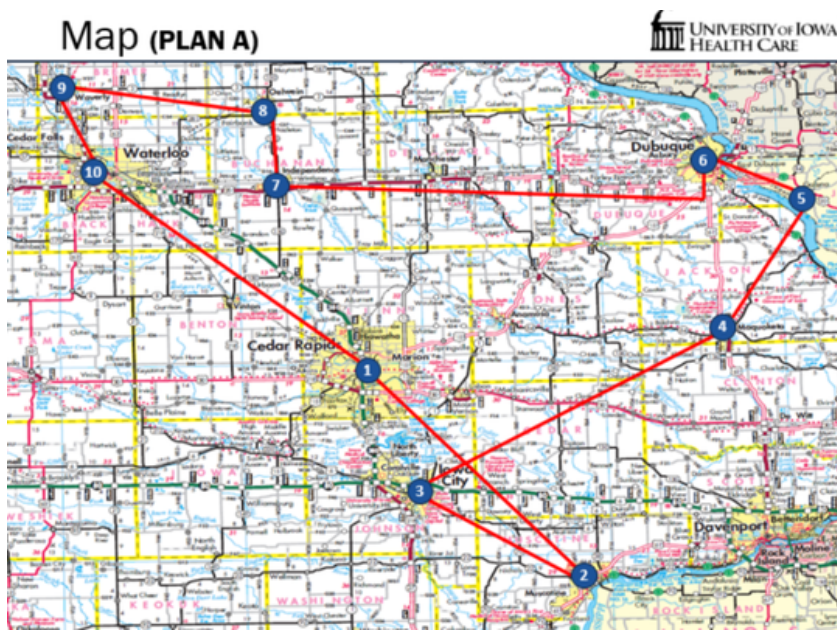


A flyby thank you from AirCare workers

If you hear something in the sky Wednesday morning, it's not a bird, it's not a plane, it's a helicopter.

Originally scheduled for Tuesday, two AirCare helicopters will be playing over portions of eastern Iowa starting at 9 a.m. Wednesday. The helicopters will begin in Cedar Rapids and fly over numerous other cities, including Iowa City, before making a final flyover in Waterloo around 2 p.m.

AirCare is an emergency transportation service partnered with University of Iowa Hospitals & Clinics as well as other area hospitals.
