# ANNUAL ALL-SYSTEMS OVERWEIGHT PERMIT

FOR COMMERCIAL & FARM VEHICLES

**UPDATED JULY 1, 2025** 

The lowa DOT is authorized to issue an annual permit for overweight divisible and indivisible loads.

This annual permit option provides flexibility and is efficient for customers.

### **FACTS ABOUT THE NEW PERMIT:**

- Allows for unlimited trips on all state roads, excluding the interstate system, and certain city/county roads.
   Cities and counties must designate which roads are not valid for travel under this permit.
- Refer to the Iowa DOT's All Systems Overweight Permit map for the list of city and county routes that are authorized.

- Valid for 12 months from date of issuance
- Cost = \$500
- Maximum weight = 12.5% over current maximum legal weight based on number of axles and distance
  - 5 axle maximum = 90,000
  - o 6 axle maximum = 101,250
  - 7 axle maximum = 108,000
- Maximum axle weight = 20,000 lbs.
- Maximum width = 8'6"
- Maximum height = 13'6"
- Maximum length = legal maximum limits for vehicle and trailer
- Valid for BOTH divisible and non-divisible loads

### **QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS**

#### When can I get the new permit?

The permit will be made available on January 1, 2023.

### Where can I get the new permit?

## Do I need to be registered for the gross weight of the load I am hauling with this permit?

Vehicles traveling under this or any other permit must be registered for the gross weight of the vehicle and the load under lowa law. Trucks or combinations transporting raw agricultural products are allowed to operate in excess of their registration weight by up to 25 percent when in lowa.

### As of July 1, 2025, can I travel on all roads in Iowa under this permit?

**Primary (state) roads:** Yes, you can travel on the primary road system (state roads) but you must review the maps found on the DOT's website to check for bridge embargoes or construction that may affect your route.

Secondary or Municipal (county or city) roads: The permit now includes all paved and non-paved farm-to-market and secondary roads that are not otherwise restricted by the local authority. Iowa DOT will be working with the local authorities to update the maps on our website to reflect the most current restrictions. **Interstate:** No, you may not use this permit to drive on the interstate. Federal regulations control interstate travel and will not allow use of this overweight permit on the interstate.

#### Is this permit only for agricultural commodities?

No, the new all-systems overweight permit is not limited to agricultural commodities but applies to all divisible and indivisible loads that otherwise meet the dimension and weight requirements. In 2022, the legislature considered a different bill that would have limited a permit to certain agricultural commodities, but that bill did not pass.

### Can I get this permit for my implement of husbandry?

No. Implements of husbandry are already allowed to travel at heavier axle weights and heavier gross weights under different lowa law. There are specific permits issued for implements of husbandry in lowa Code 321, but the other permit requirements of lowa Code 321E do not apply, including the availability of this permit.

### How is this new permit different from existing permits and the Harvest Proclamation?

City and county roads automatically included, with certain roads restricted (as of July 1, 2025)	City and county roads automatically included (except posted roads and bridges)
