PROCUREMENT AVAILABLE

The lowa DOT is excited to announce that the procurement for ADA Accessible Electric Full-Size Van, Light-Duty Bus, and Charging Stations for Public Transit Use has been finalized and information is now available on our website. We have contracted with 7 vendors to provide ADA accessible electric vehicles for conversion vans, 25' light-duty buses, and 30' light-duty buses along with several different types of level-2 and level-3 charging stations. 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

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2025 IPTA Awards



For the regional systems, earning transit system of the year by providing the most rides per dollar of expense and rides per capita, is Region 13/SWITA.



For large urban system, with the most rides per dollar of expense and most rides per revenue dollar is CAMBUS.



For small urban system, with the most rides per dollar of expense and the largest increase in ridership from 2023 to 2024, is Ottumwa Transit.

AMAZING RECOGNITION FROM THE COMMUNITY TO OUR TRANSIT AGENCIES

HIRTA:

"It is important for me to remain living in my home to continue my care-giving responsibilities. My husband has dementia. He feels safe and calm here. He can be productive and active. I feel very safe getting transportation from HIRTA."

"Speaking on occasion with HIRTA drivers on the times I take a trip is delightful. Drivers are caring and willing to communicate if you would like to do so."

IOWA CITY:

"I don't have to worry about, you know, having bus fare. So it's just easy to be able to get on and off and not have to think about that, and it's easier on my budget. "

"When I first started taking the city buses I was a student at Kirkwood, so I had to bear the cost of the semester pass for about \$100 a semester. And as someone who covers my own tuition, it was a lot to have to worry about. So fare free has been nice, to know that I can just take the bus no matter what. Not have to worry about bearing that cost every day."

CLINTON:

"I am writing to praise the quick and thoughtful action taken by the City of Clinton in remedying the longstanding North Bridge closure by offering free demand-response trips through the Municipal Transit Administration (MTA) to residents between Fulton and Clinton. You and I both know that the Iowa Department of Transportation has scheduled a full bridge closure from June 9 to November 2025 to perform required deck overlay work. MTA service - running on regular hours with reservations accepted 14 days in advance - is an equally effective solution that accommodates the needs of the people during this extended period of time. Since detour routes will probably increase traffic on the Highway 30 and Savanna/Sabula bridges, making public transit free reduces not only delays but also the overall strain on families, workers, seniors, and those with limited mobility. I urge the community to notice this initiative and react. Further, as we continue investing in critical infrastructure, I encourage the City Council to incorporate long-term contingency options - like shuttle buses or extended public transit hours - into future disruptions. Thinking ahead ensures equity of access and keeps our city linked to vital services and neighboring communities. Thank you to our city officials for finding a balance between upgrading infrastructure and thoughtful, community-oriented public service. Clinton's response is the definition of what civic responsibility is all about."

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KRISTIN'S KEYWORDS

Where did the summer go? It seems as though it went by in the blink of an eye! My family rented a house on a lake in Minnesota for a week in June where I was able to try kayaking for the first time. I really liked it! It was nice to get away without any plans except relaxation.

Our workloads didn't take vacations, however, so we are thrilled to have Jeremy Johnson-Miller back on the transit team after his nearly five years of experience with the National Aging and Disability Transportation Center and EasterSeals **Project** Action Consulting. He's already provided us with different perspectives on projects from his work around the country. Jeremy replaces Travis Estep in the of Grant Manager responsibilities for tracking funding in open grants, the Drug and Alcohol Program, Testing and Disadvantaged Business Enterprise program.

Also, in staff news, our summer intern has become our fall intern! Jacob Black agreed to stay on this fall as our intern and will be working with some data in BlackCat and Transit Vehicle Manufacturing reporting to FTA.

As the summer went by, one thing our team - and many of your transit agencies - was anxiously awaiting was word of FTA discretionary award obligations. The bus and bus facility grants announced in 2022 and 2023 were obligated by FTA this summer. (Obligated meaning we can execute the grant and issue contracts to spend the money.) One of the grants did require some changes in order to get it over the finish line, however. In late July, lowa DOT wrote to FTA offering to change the previously proposed electric vehicles (EV) to standard combustion engine buses. FTA took us up on that offer and 17 EVs were changed to gas or diesel buses and the proposed associated charging stations and electrical upgrades also removed from the were grant. With the execution of these grants we are excited to see the purchase or construction of the three facilities included become a reality.

Rolling into fall, please remember that Calendar Year 2026 Intercity Bus applications and Fiscal Year 2027 State Transit Assistance Special Project applications are due through BlackCat by October 1. Also due October 1, to lowa's DOT's Local Systems Bureau, are lowa's Clean Air Attainment Program applications for Federal Fiscal Year 2027.

Finally, yearend reviews should be starting in the next month. Please remember your prompt, detailed responses to those reviews help lowa DOT finalize statistics needed for the following fiscal year's funding formulas and are used to enter National Transit Database reporting for the small urban and regional transit systems.

As always, thank you for all you do for pubic transit in lowa.
