



Statewide Transportation Alternatives Set-Aside Program

- Current version of program in existence since 1991
- Majority of funding is distributed to Iowa's MPOs and RPAs, but \$5 million reserved for statewide projects annually with 20% target for Safe Routes to School projects
- Available to a variety of project sponsors but most applicants are cities and counties



Eligible Activities

- On-road and off-road non-motorized trail facilities, safe routes for non-drivers, conversion of abandoned rail corridors for trails, preservation/rehabilitation of historic transportation facilities among others
- Federal Recreational Trails Program eligible activities
- Infrastructure-related or non-infrastructure related Safe Routes to School Projects
- Scenic Byways





Central City Pedestrian Bridge (Central City)

This project will replace the unrepairable pedestrian portions of the Main Street Bridge with a separated 320 feet pedestrian bridge providing a safe route for students accessing Central City Community Schools.

Total Cost: \$1,750,000

Requested: \$1,400,000 (80%)

Iowa Safe Routes Partnership (Iowa Northland Regional Council of Governments)

A comprehensive program that provides support to communities by implementing SRTS initiatives, including pedestrian and bicycle safety education through encouragement activities both inside and outside the classroom.

Total Cost: \$390,002

Requested: \$312,002 (80%)




Great American Rail Trail: Weston to Underwood (Pottawattamie County Conservation Board)

Constructs a 4.9-mile paved extension from Weston to Underwood of the 5-mile Railway Highway Trail. This project is part of the Great American Rail Trail, a planned 3,700-mile coast-to-coast trail from Washington, D.C., to Washington state.

Total Cost: \$4,505,000

Requested: \$3,500,000 (80%)

Recommended: \$1,920,435





Summer Street-Dankwardt Park Connector Trail (Burlington)

This project will construct 0.62 mile of multi-use trail connecting an existing trail at Summer Street and ending at Dankwardt Park in Burlington.

Total Cost: \$942,000

Requested: \$750,000 (80%)



Camanche Trail Extensions (Camanche)

This project constructs 4,300 feet of separated trail in 3 segments along portions of Washington Boulevard, 9th Street, and 9th Avenue and 1,500 feet of bike lane along 9th Street.

Total Cost: \$649,000

Requested: \$500,000 (77%)



UNI Integrated Roadside Vegetation Management (UNI Tallgrass Prairie Center)

This project result in native grass & wildflower seed being planted in road rights-of-way across the state consistent with Integrated Roadside Vegetation Management principles.

Total Cost: \$1,064,386

Requested: \$447,956 (42%)
