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This unique site sits on an edge in the landscape between a river bottom and upland area. This setting allows a showcase of four different vegetative communities - river bottom, woodland, riverbank, and prairie.

Playing off the natural setting, the exterior and interior images in the masonry and pillars depict plant materials common to these communities.

The dual sidewalk crossing the landscape of the site represents the Mormon Trail wheel tracks.

Two overlooks are designed to look like ruins of old homesteads. One overlooks an oxbow of the Grand River, while the other overlooks Slip Bluff Lake.

The curved drives, no fence lines and skewed orientation of the rest area/welcome center structure to the interstate make it easy for visitors to lose a sense of direction at this site. To assist travelers, designers created a plaza containing a planter to be used as a giant compass.

The site offers pedestrian access to Slip Bluff County Park which is touted as having an overlook that rivals any view in Iowa.
