Story County, Iowa, is located at the crossroads of U.S. 30 (including parts of the Lincoln Highway, our nation's first transcontinental roadway) and Interstate 35, which stretches from Laredo, Texas, on the U.S.-Mexico border to Duluth, Minn. It is also the home of the Iowa Department of Transportation, formery known as the Iowa State Highway Commission.

Traveling Interstate 35, one does not fully realize the pioneering construction and safety of our nation's roadways. Seeking constant improvements in highway development, many discoveries made in lowa are now the standard across the country and throughout the world.

lowa's Good Roads Movement, which was aimed at "getting Iowa out of the mud," along with the entrepreneurial spirit of its people, lead to the invention and manufacturing of many different types of motor vehicles in the state.

The design of this rest area, including integration of its visual public artworks, commentorest and celebrates the contributions of everyone associated with Iowa's transportation system. Sculptural lantens, based on the form of the original Lincoln Highway markers, ine the entry plaza and illuminate the different methods of transportation.
