Share the Road specialty license plate is available for purchase at any county treasurer's office. Funding from the plate is directed to the lowa

Bicycle Coalition for safety education and motorist awareness.

Numbered plates are available for \$35 with a \$10 annual renewal fee. Personalized plates with up to 5 characters are available for \$60 with a \$15 annual renewal fee.

he primary purpose of this transportation map is to point out some of lowa's major trail routes and identify traffic levels on all paved roadways so that bicyclists can select routes appropriate for their skill levels



By law, bicyclists are not allowed on lowa's interstate highways, or where otherwise prohibited. Bicyclists may want to inquire locally about specific city ordinances that prohibit bicycles.

Riders assume the risk for their own safety when traveling on the state's highways, roadways and trails.
