HIGHLIGHTING UPDATES TO TRANSIT AGENCIES

CLINTON MUNICIPAL TRANSIT ADMINISTRATION (MTA)

The Municipal Transit Administration's (MTA) building at the Central Transfer Point (CTP) at the 6th Avenue South & Second Street is nearing its completion. Security cameras will be installed in and around the building for the safety and security of passengers. The passenger waiting area will be open 6 AM to 5:30 PM, Monday - Friday, and on Saturdays from 8 AM to 3:00 PM. The bus station building will be secured and closed on Sundays and Holidays, when the MTA buses are not operating.

The new bus station building has a climate-controlled waiting area for the bus passengers. The waiting area is facing the street, so the passengers are able to see the buses as they pull into the transfer point.







SIOUXLAND INTERSTATE METROPOLITAN PLANNING COUNCIL (SIMPCO)

SRTS installed a bus wash in October 2024 to wash 45 vehicles and a shop truck using PTIG grants of \$600,000 (80% state participation and 20% local participation). Drivers use their keycards to open the entrance door and select bus or van. The undercarriage receives a high-pressure cleaning as the vehicle enters the wash. After pulling up to the wash system, the gantry will wash the vehicle with one top brush and two side brushes. Once the wash is finished, the driver goes through the reverse osmosis spot rinse. The exit door will automatically open for the vehicle to be parked in the garage or to exit the garage.

This bus wash unit has benefited our transit system by keeping fleet cleaned daily, reducing external bus wash expenses, and improving the quality of the vehicles



FY 2024 RIDERSHIP AND MILEAGE STATISTICS COMPARED TO FYS 2023 AND 2019

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KRISTIN'S KEYWORDS

We've made it to Spring Break! We've had an active few months, so I'm guessing we could all use break.

In December, Iowa DOT released an Invitation for Bids (IFB) for electric vans and light-duty buses plus charging stations. As a DOT, under Federal Transit Administration (FTA) rules, we are able to award any responsive, responsible bidder. Therefore, after reviewing responses to specifications, ensuring proper certifications were signed, and the companies were in good standing with the Federal government through sam.gov, lowa DOT notified two van bidders, one 25' bus vendor, two 30' bus vendors, and six charging station vendors of their selection of contracts. It is expected these contracts will be in place by lowa's public transit mid-April. agencies will be able to order off these contracts at that time, with vendor options to be posted on our procurement website. Due to the unpredictable costs seen over the last several years, each contract will only be for one year, with four one-year extensions possible. With Matt int he lead role and Laura and Emma contributing greatly, this procurement is coming to fruition.

Thank you to those public transit managers who gave input on features they'd prefer on the electric vehicles. The next procurement on the docket is for gas or diesel, non-electric, buses; Laura will lead that effort.

lowa's FY 2025 FTA Section 5311 grant was awarded by FTA earlier this month. Eligible rural and small urban public transit agencies should have received those contracts through Seamless for digital signatures. If you have not seen that contract in your inbox, please contact Amy. For updates on other grants, please see the grant status chart included in this newsletter. We intend to provide this chart in each newsletter and the IPTA conference presentations to keep everyone up-to-date.

With uncertainty of funding amounts, availability, and timing, 2025 has been bumpy. Iowa DOT's transit team has and will continue to keep the transit managers apprised of what we know, when we know it. I do ask that all you do the same for us - if you're hearing news about federal funding or projects, please pass this along to help expand our knowledge. You may just have the scoop on information we haven't heard or read yet. As always, thank you for all you do for public transit in Iowa.
