 - **Purpose:** Present the latest FY 2022 monthly highway program balance report. When combined with the January 2022 Program amendment, we began FY 2022 over-programmed by \$25.6 million. Through February, receipts to the Primary Road Fund have come in \$10.8 million above forecast. Through the March letting, project costs are \$62.3 million above programmed amounts. When all combined, the current highway program balance is \$77.1 million over-programmed.
