 When combined with the January 2022 Program amendment, we began FY
 2022 over-programmed by \$25.6 million. Through April, receipts to the Primary
 Road Fund have come in \$16.8 million above forecast. Through the May letting,
 project costs are \$74.1 million above programmed amounts. When all
 combined, the current highway program balance is \$82.9 million overprogrammed.
