Purpose: Present the latest FY 2020 monthly highway program balance report.
Through August, receipts to the Primary Road Fund have come in \$16.4 million
above forecast. Through the September letting, project costs are \$37.1 million
above programmed amounts. When combined with the \$51.7 million overprogrammed amount we began FY 2020, the current highway program balance
is \$72.4 million over-programmed.

The forecast low Primary Road Fund balance for FY 2020 is in November of 2019 at \$3.8 million. As expected, this is a much-improved number than presented last month and we expect it will continue to improve next month.
