SUBJECT

This informational memo explains updates to administrative rule chapter 761—634, Driver Education.

SUMMARY

The updates to this rule chapter align with legislation passed during the 2021 legislative session that expanded the parent-taught driver's education program to any student currently attending a public school, accredited nonpublic school, or who is receiving homeschool education and added distracted driving as a required topic of instruction for any driver's education course.

This memo is most applicable to staff that approve applications for driver's education courses and the parent-taught driver's program or answer questions about those programs.

The administrative rule amendments are effective January 5, 2022.

CURRENT

This rule chapter used to limit the parent-taught driver's education program only to students who received home school education and did not explicitly require distracted driving as a required topic of an approved driver's education course.
