

# Motor Vehicle Division Informational Memo # 22-14 Emergency Contact Administrative Rule Updates

### SUBJECT

This informational memo explains updates to administrative rule chapter 761—601, Application for license and is most applicable to staff that process requests to add emergency contact information to a person's driving record.

#### SUMMARY

The updates to this rule chapter align with legislation passed during the 2021 legislative session that required the DOT to begin requesting that customers voluntarily provide emergency contact information for up to two persons, which will be shared with law enforcement to be used in the event of an emergency.

### The administrative rule amendments are effective June 8, 2022.
