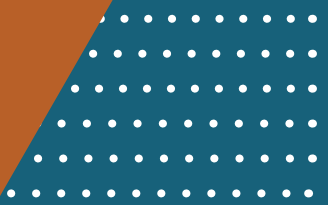

# TYPES OF PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT

We value your feedback and encourage you to participate in all Public Involvement events in your area.

Examples of information we share at Public Involvement Events:

- Construction timelines/ impacts/costs
- Project Design
- Road closures & detours



## Open Houses

Come and go at any time, these Public Involvement Events have no formal presentation.

Staff will be there to answer your questions.

Comments and questions about the project are welcomed.

If you are not able to attend the Open House, you may watch the Online Video and submit comments and questions.



## Online Video

Online videos cover the same information you would see at an Open House.

You can view it online when you want.

Anytime during the video, you can submit comments and questions.



## Online Comments Only

For smaller projects or Corridor Preservation Zones (CPZ), we may not host an open house nor have an online video. Instead, we may post basic project information online. Comments and questions about the project are welcomed.



## Public Hearings

Public Hearings are scheduled for a set time, have a formal presentation and include a Q&A session for the public. Public Hearings are required for projects with an Environmental Assessment (EA), Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) or the acquisition of agricultural parcels of 10 acres or more (Iowa Code 6B). If you are not able to attend the Public Hearing, you may watch the Online Video and submit comments and questions.
