What is the intended benefit of the rule?

The intended benefit of this chapter is to provide guidance on the eligibility requirements and application process for lowa businesses that use transporter plates as allowed by lowa Code sections 321.57 to 321.63.

Is the benefit being achieved? Please provide evidence.

Yes. There are over 115 transporters that have requested and are utilizing transporter plates.

What are the costs incurred by the public to comply with the rule?

Any costs to the public related to applying to use transporter plates are because of the underlying statute, which requires the Department to make transporter plates available for use by qualified applicants.

The statute requires a \$70 application fee for a two-year certificate, signifying the business's authority to use transporter plates.

What are the costs to the agency or any other agency to implement/enforce the rule?

There are no costs to the Department to implement the rules beyond those that would otherwise be required to administer the statute.

Do the costs justify the benefits achieved? Please explain.

Yes. The rules establish the eligibility requirements and application process for Iowa businesses that use transporter plates. This helps ensure only eligible entities are approved to use transporter plates.

The Department recommends explicit rulemaking authority be added to Iowa Code section 321.58 for the transporter plate application and approval process. Although the Iowa Code requires an entity seeking to utilize transporter plates to apply to the Department, the Iowa Code does not outline the application process, or the eligibility requirements, which is instead done via administrative rule. The Department currently relies on general rulemaking authority in Iowa Code section 307.12(1)"j" for the following rules:
