

**Iowa DOT's Administrative Rules Affected by 2014 Legislation**

*(Please note that other administrative rules may need to be updated. This list does not include all the rule changes that may be needed.)*

- SF 303                    Sections 10 through 28 make changes relating to military license plates. These changes allow an owner to receive one set of certain military special registration plates at no charge. Section 28 creates a new United States veteran special plate.
- SF 2228                    Amends Code section 321.194 and relates to a minor’s school license. Expands where a student may drive for the purposes of participating in extracurricular activities when conducted under a sharing agreement with the student’s school of enrollment.
- SF 2349                    Section 23 amends Iowa Code section 22.7 and concerns confidential records of electronic mail addresses of individuals when state agencies collect the addresses for the sole purpose of disseminating routine information and notices through electronic communication that are not prepared for a specific recipient. This type of confidential record is amended by adding the individual’s phone number and personally identifiable information and also adds that this information shall be confidential when it is collected by state agencies for the sole purpose of disseminating emergency information that is not prepared for a specific recipient.
- SF 2355                    Sections 1 through 10 make changes to Code chapters 306 and 306C regarding junkyards and advertising devices. Section 5 requires the DOT to adopt rules concerning the requirement that junkyards be screened, if feasible, by the DOT or the owner to obscure the junkyard from the main-traveled way of certain highways.
- Section 13 requires the DOT to adopt rules concerning third-party testers who administer the driving skills test required for a commercial driver’s license. This section is effective upon enactment, May 30, 2014. **Note:** This section is repealed five years after the effective date.
- Sections 26 through 32 concern changes to Code sections relating to motor vehicle dealers. Section 28 amends Code section 321.60 by adding a \$750 special plate fee for a vehicle that is hauling a load or towing a trailer. Section 31 amends Code section 321.105A by adding an exemption from the new registration fee for vehicles primarily used by dealer’s customers while the customer’s vehicles are being serviced or repaired by the dealer. Section 32 adds new Code section 322.7B that allows a motor vehicle dealer to sell a used motor truck on a consignment basis under certain conditions.
- SF 2360                    Section 6 requires the Department of Public Health, in consultation with the

DOT, to adopt rules to administer this bill and shall include, but not be limited to, rules to establish the manner in which the Department of Public Health shall consider applications for new and renewal cannabidiol registration cards.

SF 2364

Sections 4 through 16 concern motorsports recreational vehicles. Section 12 states that rules adopted under Code section 321.450 applicable to the transportation of any fuel used in race car engines shall not apply to the transportation of such fuel if the fuel is contained in the fuel cells of a race car being transported in a trailer and the fuel cells are certified by SFI Foundation Inc.
