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Linking Iowa's Freight Transportation System (LIFTS) Program

- Purpose of the program:
 - Enhance economic development by improving multimodal freight transportation system
 - Provide flexible funding for changing demands of freight transportation system
 - Enhance ability to provide competitive transportation options for shipment of products and moving goods
 - Incentivize alternate modes for economic development partnership purposes



LIFTS Funding

- For FY 2016
 - Utilize current balance of State Infrastructure Bank funds (~\$2.6 million) for LIFTS Program
 - Award funds as grants
 - Demonstrate demand and value of LIFTS Program to support future appropriations



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Potential Types of Projects

- Develop or improve transload facilities transfer products between modes
- Improve capacity at barge terminal facilities
- Intermodal facility partnerships with private industry
- Remove height and/or weight restrictions on existing infrastructure
- Increase weight capacity of rail lines to handle heavier cars
- Expand/reconfigure rail yards to increase capacity or reduce dwell time
- Rehabilitate freight infrastructure to improve condition or capacity
- Improve safety to increase freight capacity



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LIFTS Program Criteria

- Applicant Eligibility:
 - o Transportation provider or user
 - o City or county
 - Planning organization
 - o Other entity interested in freight transportation
- Public applicants or public-private partnerships
 - o Eligible for 80% grant funding
- Private applicants
 - o Eligible for 50% grant funding



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LIFTS Program Criteria

- Eligible project costs:
 - Modernization, upgrading or expansion of existing and new freight transportation facilities that support direct freight interchange between highway and rail carriers
 - Modernization, upgrading or expansion of existing and new modal links, including air freight facilities, water port facilities, intermodal facilities, and transload locations.
 - Infrastructure that is integral to a freight transportation system, including bridges, docks, and equipment.
 - o Right of way acquisition costs
 - o Planning and feasibility studies of a freight facility
 - o Equipment that is integral to a freight transportation improvement.



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LIFTS Program Criteria

- Ineligible project costs:
 - o Passenger rail
 - o Public transit and commuter rail
 - Recreational trails
 - o Rolling stock
 - o Transportation tourist sites
 - o Highway projects typically eligible for traditional highway funding



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LIFTS Project Application

Applications will include:

- · Purpose, need and benefits of the project
- · Freight shipping projections
- Benefits to the highway system (such as diverted freight, emissions reductions, reduced congestion)
- Project partners
- LIFTS funding request
- Matching funds, source, status of commitment
- · Economic benefits, including job creation
- Project schedule
- · Right of way status
- Environmental permitting status



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LIFTS Project Evaluation

Projects will be evaluated by a review of:

- Freight Transportation Benefits including freight connectivity, how the project addresses freight challenges and improves freight mobility and reliability, and provides benefits to customers and shippers,
- Economic Benefits including job creation and retention, state-wide or regional influence, including benefits and cost savings to customers and shippers, other investment by sponsor (leveraging private investment)
- **Public Benefits** including highway user benefits, safety, congestion relief, environmental and other public benefits
- **Project Readiness** including design status, environmental clearances, permitting, expected timeline of project



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LIFTS Schedule

- August 21st: Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA)
- August 27th: Informative Webinar
- October 26th Applications due
- December 7, 2015 Present funding recommendation to Commission
- January 12, 2016 Seek Commission action

All projects must be complete within 36 months of executed agreement
