# Innovations and New Approaches to Changing Transportation

- This presentation was by Liberty Mobility Now, which seems to be a hybrid of a ride service and mobility management for rural areas. # Overview of the Process

There are 3 steps required before we start service in a community. First, we require that the organization serving as the lead agency in the service deployment has completed and paid the application fee. Next, we request the applicant complete the scoping

document (complete here) and we set up a time for a pre-proposal conference call. Together, we go through in-detail the challenges in the community, existing reports or human service coordinated plans, our technology, the partners together at the table, and develop the goals of the Liberty Mobility as a Service launch. Once we agree on the proposal, we finalize the timeline for implementation and payment plan. The process is outlined below:
