CARES Act Grant Application for 5311 Subrecipients and Priorities

- For Large Urban Systems serving areas between 50,000 and 199,999 population receiving 5307 dollars, Public Transit Bureau (PTB) staff sent written the Governor's Apportionment sub-allocation letter in early April
- While capital projects and some other costs are an allowable expense under the CARES Act, for small urban and regional transit systems, the PTB is prioritizing operating costs and losses incurred due to COVID-19
- To expedite grant approval by FTA for urgent operating needs, lowa DOT applied for a phase I CARES Act Funding for operations costs only
- Out of the **\$42,820,958** allocation for rural regions, we have applied for and received **\$33,288,313** for operations.



- ~20% of the rural apportionments remaining to be programmed for agencies who indicated interest in capital or other projects. Iowa DOT will reevaluate and consider adding these projects to the grant if COVID-related operation deficits are being met
- Guidance was given to transit agencies to prioritize CARES Act funding to accommodate projected future operating deficits that might occur for quite a while into the future as it is hard to predict how long it will take for operations to get back to normal and revenues to return to previous levels
