pedestrian and bicycle bridge) on the north side of U.S. 67/River Drive on the original bridge berm. It will feature native limestone facing and preserve an original rail clearly visible from street level. Securing critical leadership fudning for shovel-ready Phase I North

will act as a catalyst to raise the remaining funds for future phases. The full scope of the multiphase plan will replicate one span of the first railroad bridge to cross the Mississippi River. It will stop short of the river but will cross an active rail line and four-

lane U.S. 67 to access River Heritage Park, connect to the

American Discovery and Mississippi River Trails to the south and

to sidewalks and bicycle route to the north.
