


Questions and Answers

Nothing has changed for the regular swap program. The Transportation Commission approved some swap policy changes earlier this month but those had no impact on the regular swap program. The approved changes were to accommodate the allocation of COVID Relief funding to cities and counties in a timely manner.



The Iowa DOT's Open Data Portal has the latest bridge information in a GIS shapefile for anyone wanting to access or download it. It is updated daily as inspections occur. You can access it and download it <u>here</u>.
