Background

Well, what is it?: "Urban area boundaries are fixed primarily for capital project funding and are not to be confused with boundaries established for the comprehensive, cooperative and continuing urban transportation planning process."





Background

What is involved?:

- The FHWA and Census define an urban area boundary, largely on population density via a set of GIS operations.
- State DOTs work with local partners to review and amend the boundary for formal adoption and use until the next Decennial Census effort.



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Background

Who is or should be involved?:

- Systems Planning and the District Planners will administer the update process,
- District Planners will work with RPAs, MPOs, Counties, State Officials (for joint-state jurisdictions), and the UABs themselves.



Why Locals Should Care

- The UAB is what defines eligibility or jurisdiction for several federal and state programs, including but not limited to:
 - Federal Functional Classification (FFC)
 - Highway Performance Monitoring System (HPMS)
 - Surface Transportation Block Grant (STBG)
 - Set-Aside: Transportation Alternatives (TA)
- It is used to define areas as urban versus rural for use in statistical tabulation, such as micropolitan areas, population characteristics, etc.



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Why Locals Should Care

- 3 Specific to MPOs and RPAs;
 - 5,000 to 49,999 in population, UABs:
 - Determine the boundary that encompasses facilities eligible for certain funding streams.
 - Program Management uses the initial listed population figure (before any adjustments) for STBG and TA calculations.
 - 50,000+ in population, UABs:
 - Determine the jurisdiction/responsibility between an MPO and an RPA*.
 - Program Management uses the adjusted/approved boundary for STBG and TAP calculations.



Why Locals Should Care

- The UAB is developed per criteria to "...define urban areas in a nationally consistent and objective manner...while maintaining continuity with previous decades' definitions."²
 Therefore, cooperative collaboration can help ensure there are no surprises.
- Only once every 10 years is this available for change and there is no chance to challenge, if a community does not make the list.

FHWA Timeline

2024 December 1st UAB Changes Submitted

FHWA has given 24 months to finish meeting with MPO's and cities. Also, all changes to the Urban Boundaries need to be submitted by this time.

2022 DECEMBER

released to the DOT by the end of
December listing any additions and
subtractions from the UAB list

2026 DECEMBER 1ST FFC Changes Submitted

We also have 24 months from the end of the UAB process to complete and submit any FFC classification changes

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UAB Timeline overview

- December 2022, the Census Bureau publishes the final census listing and shapefiles for all qualifying urban areas.
- Spring 2023, District Planners to host meetings with qualifying urban areas, to review and formalize the boundary.
- Summer 2023, Systems Planning will start to review and create draft deliverables for review and preliminary approval with FHWA.
- November 2023, signatures obtained for preliminarily approved boundaries.
- June 2024, final GIS upload to be completed (deadline, December 2024).



FFC Timeline overview

- 1 Summer 2023, preliminary FHWA approval of UAB changes begins.
- Fall 2023, Systems Planning to begin identifying **UAB related FFC** changes and review with the group to incorporate.
- Fall 2023, Local Agencies to begin to identify **additional FFC** changes not associated with the UAB update (these will follow the current policy process).
- Early 2024, DOT to begin reviewing FFC change applications with FHWA.
- June 2026 FFC changes finalized (deadline, December 2026).




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2020 Process Resources

Custom GIS Web-Portal for UAB Edits:

- Streamlines the entry of changes.
- Reduces mis-interpretation.
- Speeds up final material creation.
- Integrates documentation







2020 Process Resources

Overlapping Schedule for FFC Edits:

- Faster identification of UAB related FFC changes.
- A smoother flow to more easily accommodate non-UAB related FFC changes
