

Section 5339 Bus and Bus Facilities Formula Program

Direct apportionments:

- Urban (50-200K population) \$1,274,165
- Statewide \$3,500,000
- Council Bluffs (IA/NE) \$1,096,504
- Davenport (IA/IL) \$580,929
- Des Moines \$883,393

Section 5339 Bus and Bus Facilities Formula Program
Distributed based on Public Transit Management System (PTMS) and availability of local match

State apportionments:

Urban (50-200K Population) – \$1,274,165

Two transit systems, four vehicles

Statewide - to be used in non-urbanized areas under 50K population - \$3,500,000

Sixteen transit systems, forty-four vehicles

Congestion Mitigation Air Quality Program (CMAQ)

- FY 2018 allocation: \$3,000,000
- Three Urban Systems, three vehicles \$1,149,139
- Eleven non-urban transit systems, twenty eight vehicles -\$1,850,861

Contingency funds from previous FY \$223,497

Two non-urban, two vehicles - \$223,497

Bus and Bus Infrastructure Program

FTA 5339(b) Grants for Buses and Bus Facilities Infrastructure Investment Program (Bus and Bus Infrastructure Program)

- Funding to improve the condition of bus fleets and facilities around the nation
- Competitive application process
- \$264 million awarded
 - 453 applications received
 - \$2.5 billion requested

Bus and Bus Infrastructure Program

Iowa Rural Transit Bus Replacement Project Application

- Iowa DOT applied for \$22.6 million
- Replace 301 vehicles operating beyond their federal useful life

Iowa Urban Transit Bus Replacement Project Application

- Iowa DOT applied for \$22.6 million
- Replace 63 vehicles operating beyond their federal useful life

Grant Award


- \$3.6 million to replace 18 vehicles at 11 public transit systems
- Utilized the Public Transit Management System (PTMS) process
 - Points awarded based on age and mileage
 - Prioritize highest points down

Summary:

Federal Funds Available - \$11,597,662 Federal/Local Funds - \$13,894,940


Twenty-six transit systems will be able to purchase 99 vehicles

Iowa's Public Transit System




Iowa Public Transit State Programs

State Transit Assistance Program

State Transit Assistance (STA) formula \$14,204,254 Rides/expense, miles/expense, local support

STA Special projects set-aside

\$300,000

Total FY 2019 STA projection

\$14,504,254

Public Transit Infrastructure Grants program (PTIG)

- Program created by 2006 General Assembly
 - Funds vertical infrastructure projects for public transit
 - All 35 public transit systems are eligible
- 2018 General Assembly
 - Appropriated \$1.5 million for FY 2019
- \$158,606 available for reprogramming
- Total FY 19 Available Funding: \$1,658,606

Public Transit Infrastructure Grants program

- Project selection criteria
 - No more than 40% of the appropriation can be awarded to an individual transit system.
 - Structural integrity of existing facilities
 - Safety enhancements to existing facilities
 - New facilities
 - Projects should be "shovel ready" and capable of completion in 18 months

Public Transit Infrastructure Grant program

- Six applications received
- \$1,658,606 available
- Recommend funding five projects
