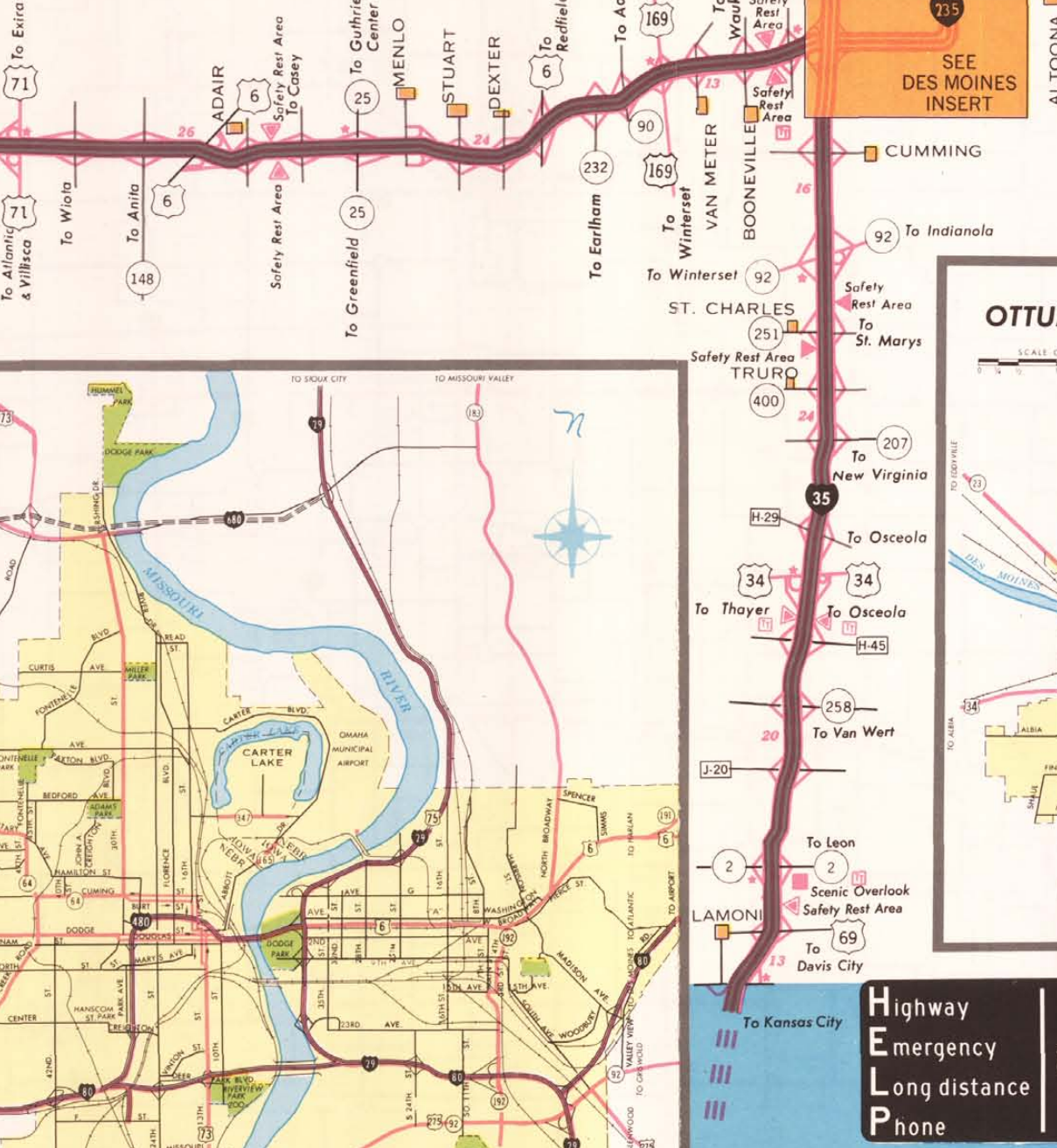
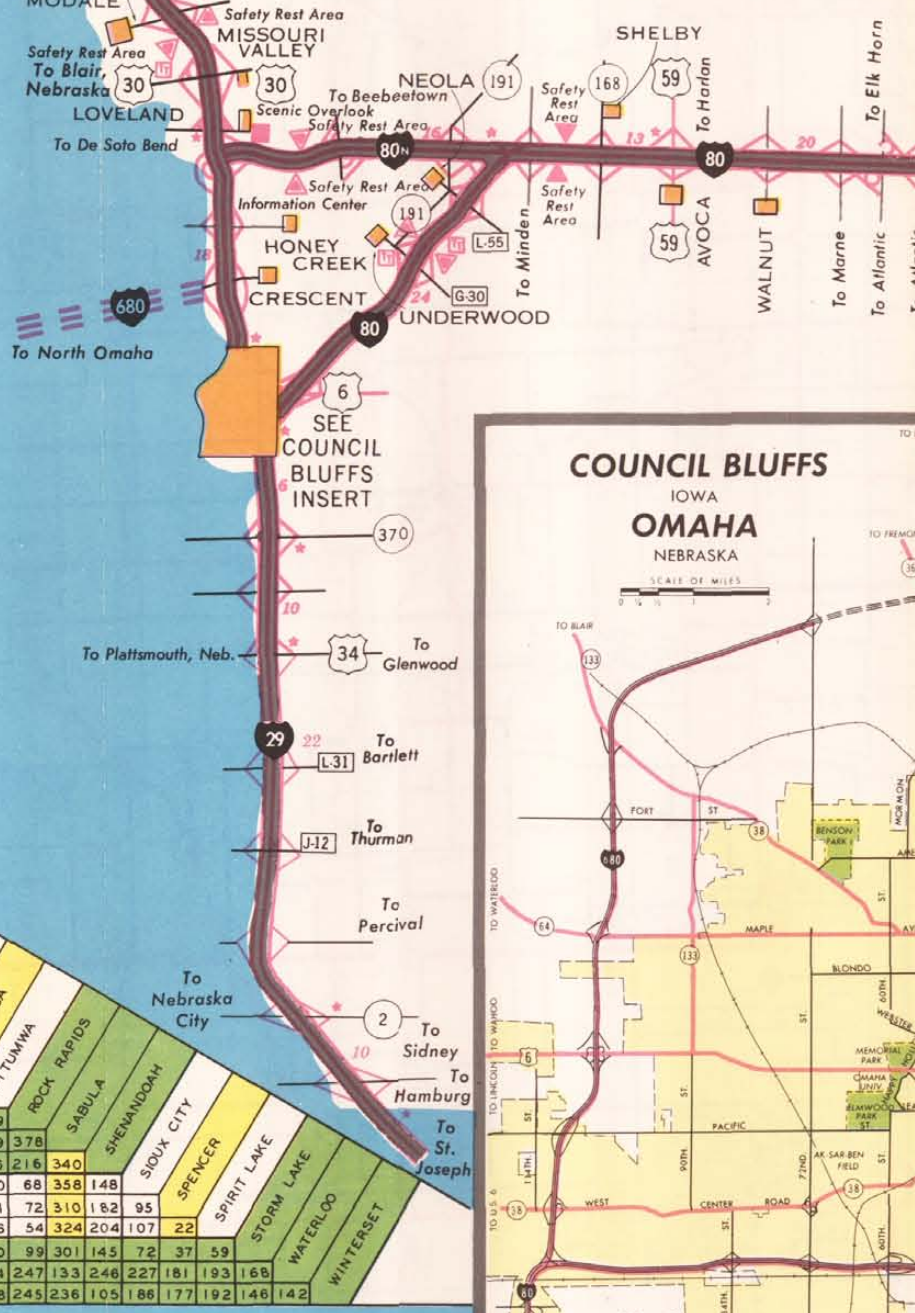
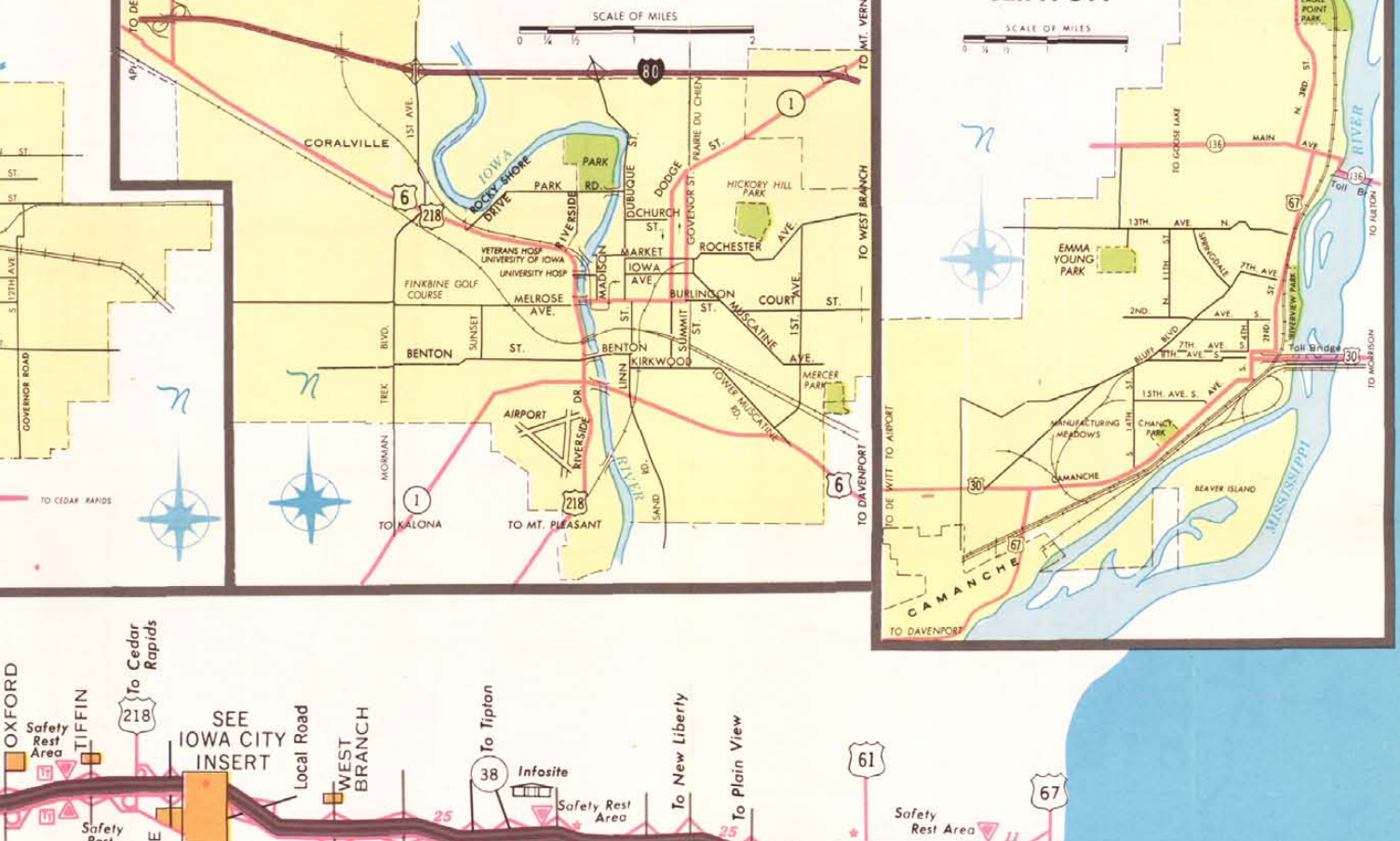
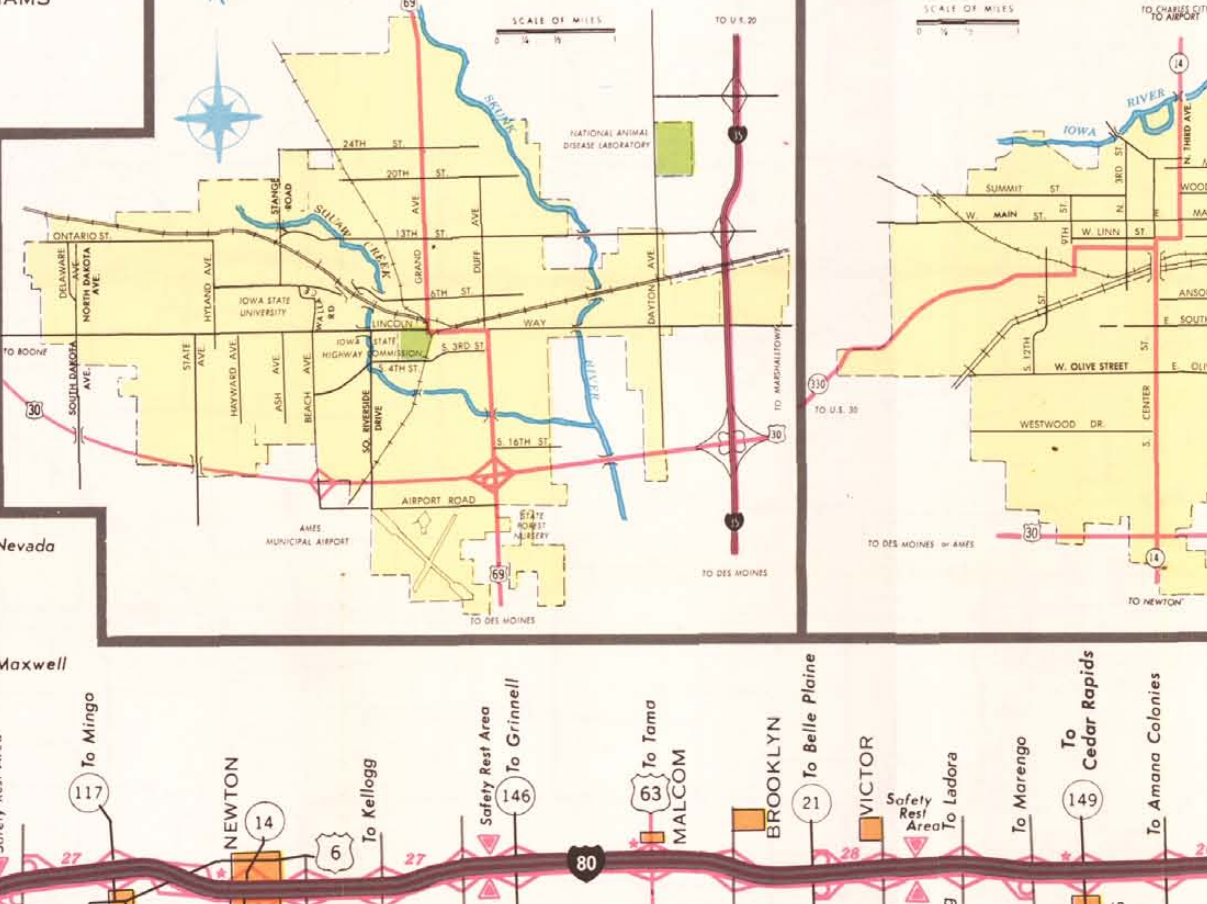
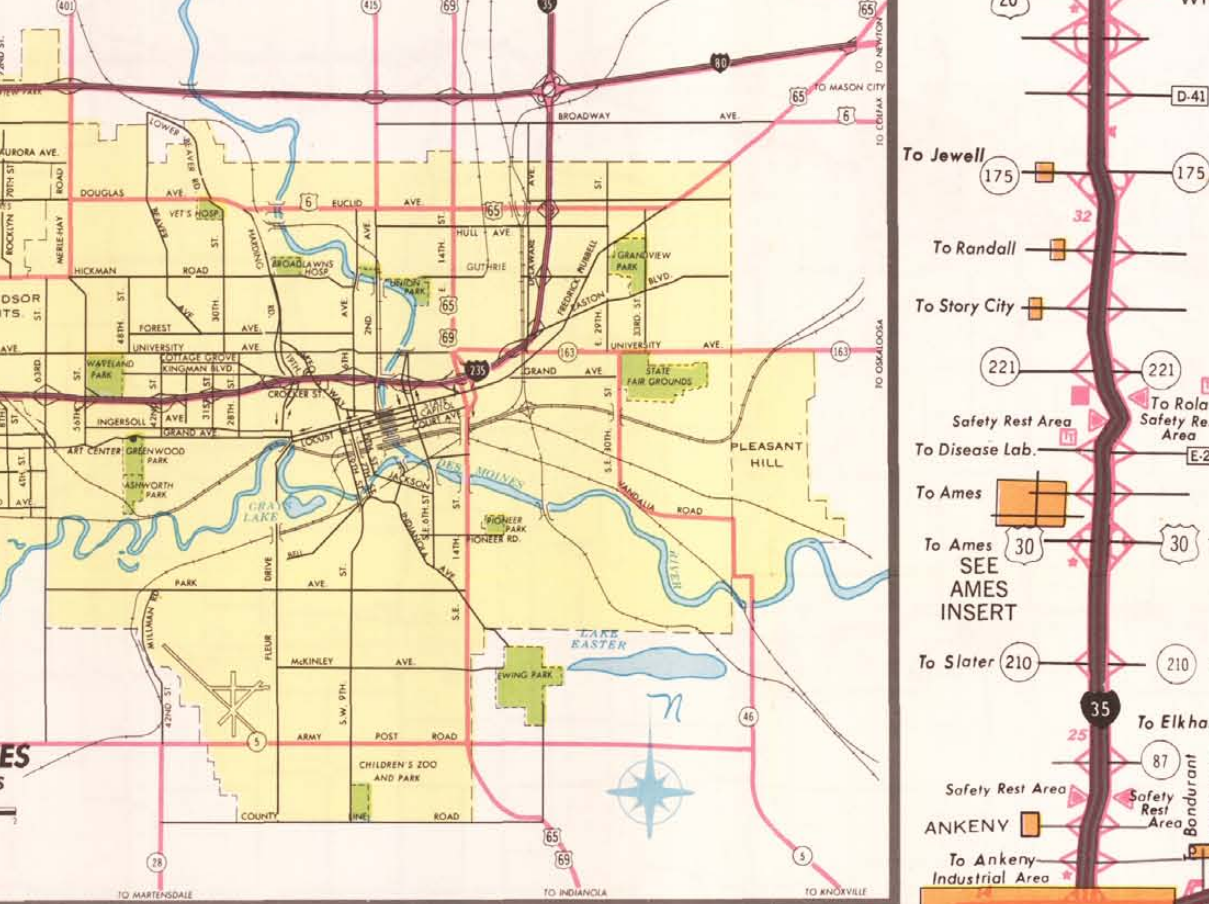
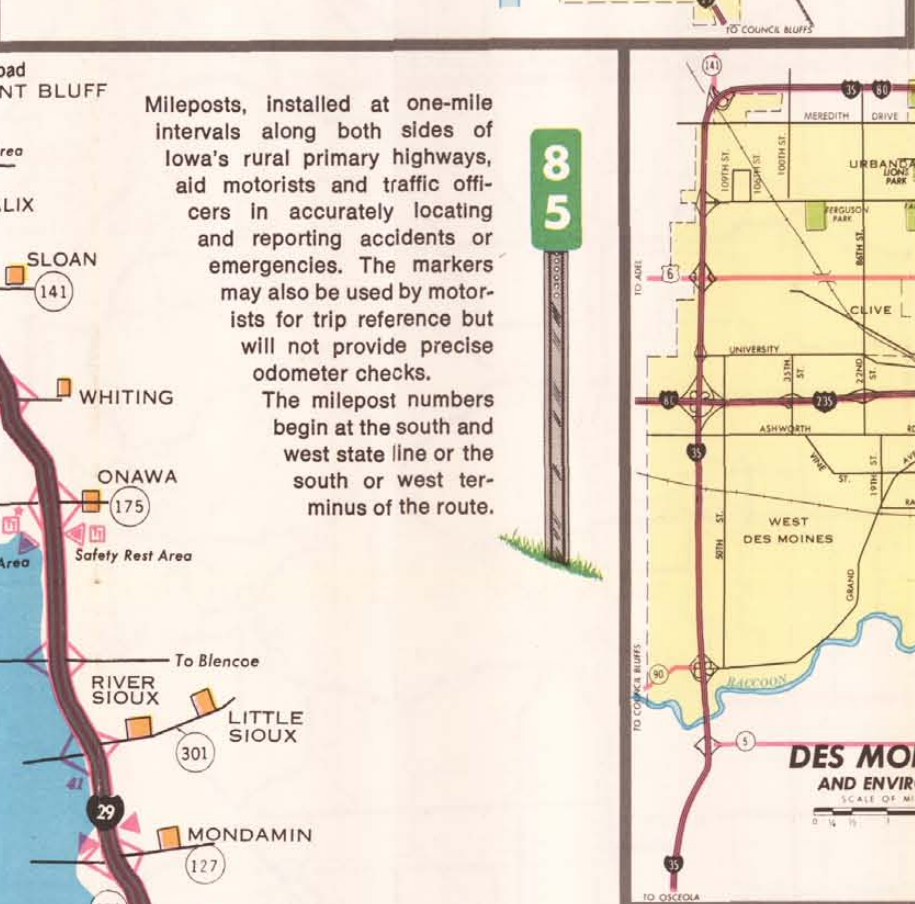
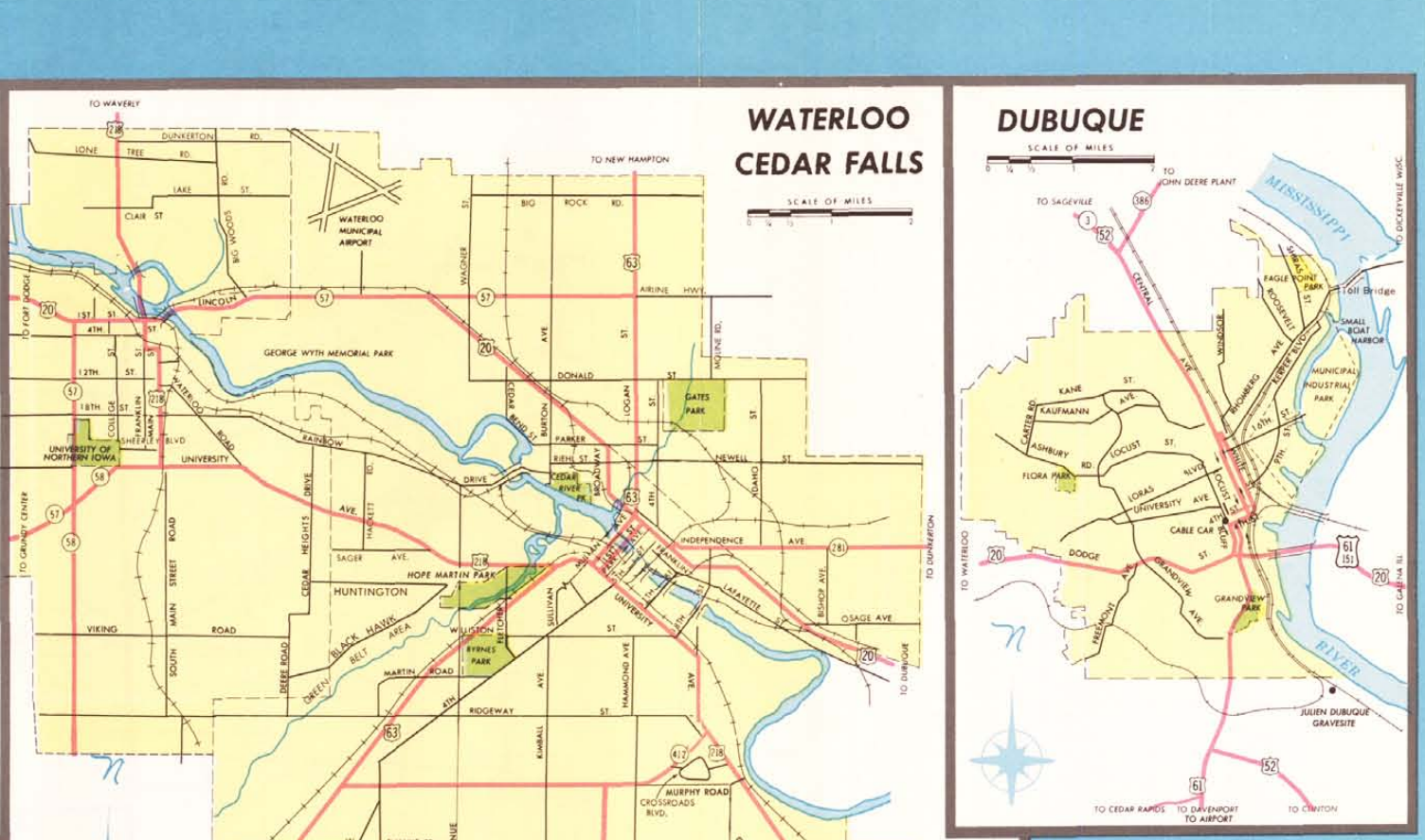
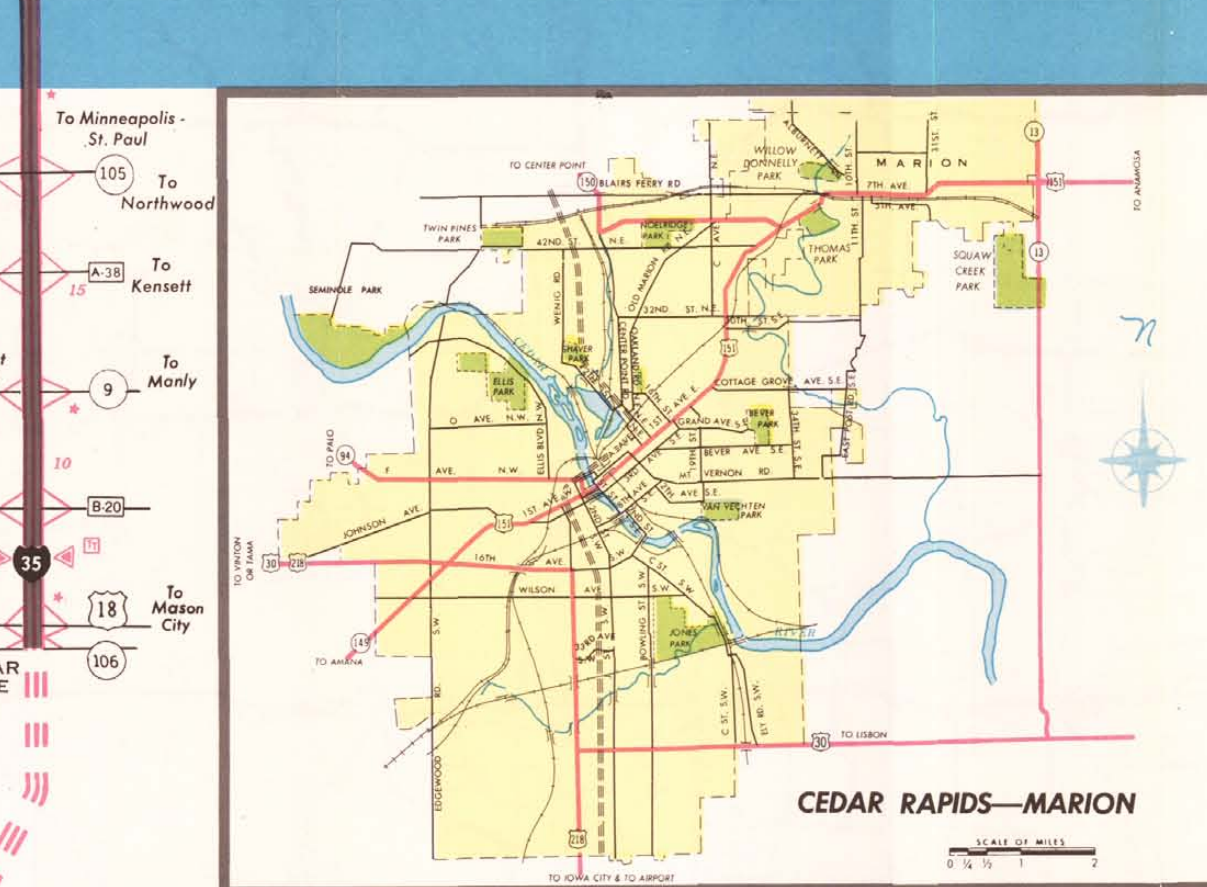
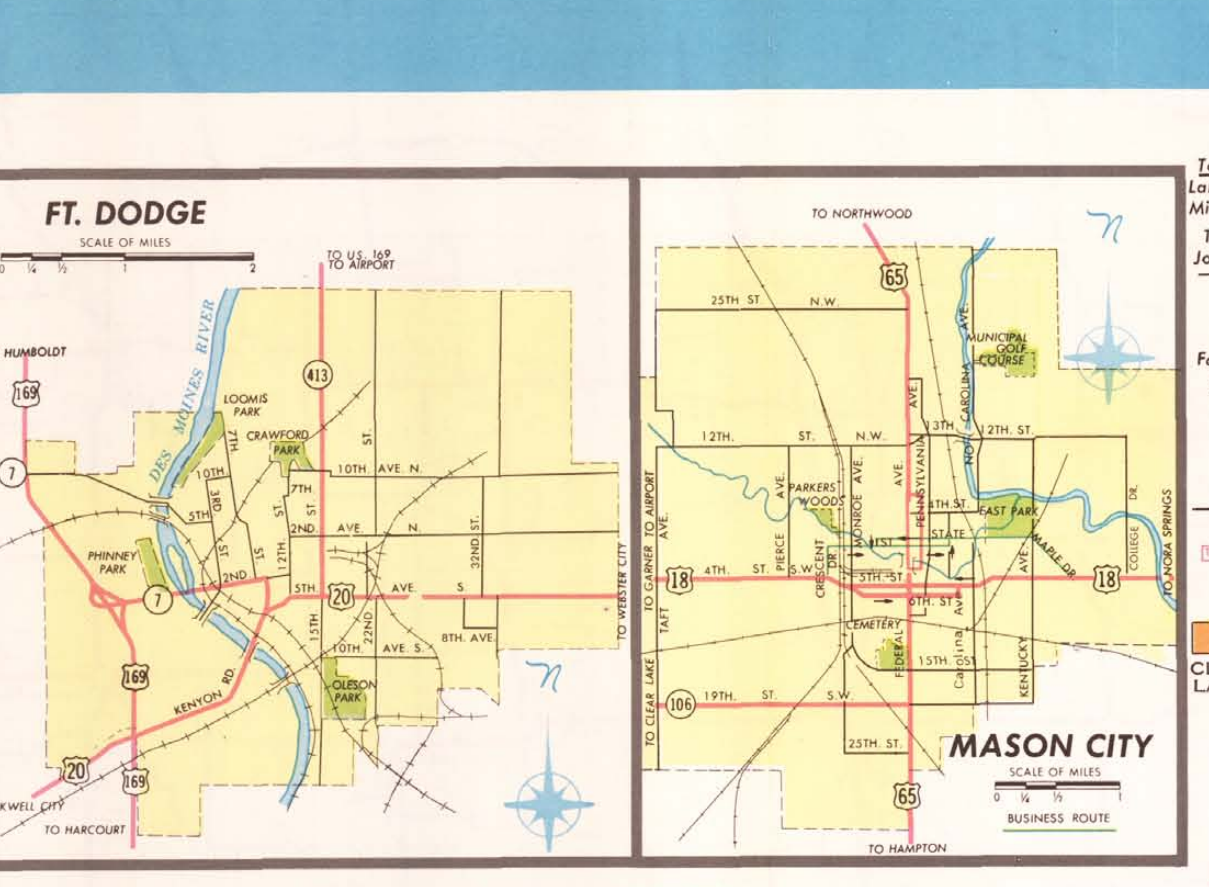
COVER On June 17, 1773, the French explorers, Louis Joliet and Jacques Marquette, with five companions and two canoes, entered the Mississippi River at the mouth of the Wisconsin. Looking west across the wide river, they saw a row of high bluffs which Marquette called "mountains". This was Iowa. For eight days they paddled down the great river spending their nights on sand bars. On June 25, seeing human footprints on the west bank, they landed on Iowa soil at the mouth of the Iowa River near what is now Tolebores where they met with friendly Indians.

This year, 1973, Iowa proudly celebrates the 300th Anniversary of this historic occasion. Our cover picture, "Joliet and Marquette Explorations on the Mississippi River", was reproduced from an original painting in the series titled "America in the Making" by W. C. Weythe. The paintings, commissioned by John Morrell and Company, depicting twelve famous events in American history, were given to Iowa State University in 1949 and are now on display in the University Library Department of Special Collections.
